Cast out a line during the Urban Fishing Festival

It's been said that you have to travel a long distance just to find a place to go fishing.

There's some truth to that saying, depending on what species you intend to pursue.

But if you just want to wet a line that's within an easy commute or perhaps teach a novice the fine art of this recreational pastime, the Ministry of Natural Resources is quick to point out opportunities exist almost at your front doorstep.

For the last 16 years, the ministry has been trying to emphasize this point through the staging of its Urban Fishing Festival.

With this year's event taking place at four different locations, two will be held within the boundaries of York Region.

On Saturday, Toogood Pond in Unionville will host one event, that is co-sponsored by the Town of Markham, Knights of Columbus-St. Justin Martyr Council, the Toronto Region Conservation Authority, the Metro-East Anglers and Ministry of Natural Resources Aurora District office, starting at noon and running until 3 p.m.

The following day, the Optimists of York Region, Aurora and Simcoe Bassmasters, Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority and ministry's Aurora District office will sponsor an event at Fairy Lake in Newmarket from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Wil Wegman, a ministry spokesman from the Aurora District office, notes those intending to try their hand at the sport do not require any prior experience or equipment.

A number of rods and simple tackle will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Along with the opportunity to get indoctrinated into the sport, the festival will stage a number of contests and prize giveaways and angling demonstrations.

"The goal is to show people first hand that you don't have to travel a long ways to go fishing," said Wegman.

As a bonus, those wetting a line this weekend will not require a residential angling licence as the festivals are a part of the Ontario Family Fishing Weekend, which begins tomorrow and concludes Sunday.

During those days, Canadian residents may fish in Ontario without having to purchase an angling licence.

Those without a licence must abide by the Conservation Licence limits set out in the current Ontario Recreational Fishing Regulations Summary, which are available from the ministry's office, sporting good stores or the ministry's Web site at www.mnr.gov.on.ca/MNR/pubs/pubmenu.html.
