2001 FINAL COMMERCIAL INDUSTRIAL & MULTI- RESIDENTIAL TAX BILLS

1st Instalment Due - October 19, 2001
2nd Instalment Due - November 16, 2001

COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL & MULTI-RESIDENTIAL TAX bills have now been mailed. Ratepayers who have not received their bills should make immediate application to the Municipal Tax Department.

THE PENALTY charged for non-payment of 2001 taxes is one and one-quarter (1 1/4) percent imposed on the first day of default and on the first day of each month thereafter.

FAILURE TO receive a tax bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of taxes nor the penalty charges for late payment.

TAX PAYMENTS may be made by mail, or in person at the Town Office and at most Financial Institutions through tellers, banking machines and by telephone. Banking fees may apply. Penalty will be charged and added to your tax account at our office on payments made at the bank after the due dates. After hours tax payments may be left in the drop box at the front west entrance door of the Imperial Building (37 Sandiford Drive).

PUBLIC MEETING

You are invited to attend a Public Meeting to be held by the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville to consider a complete hunting ban within the municipality. A request has been received that the Town review By-law 96-55-HU being a by-law to regulate the discharge of firearms. It has been five years since the current by-law was adopted and during this time the residential population has increased and resident and non-resident licenses issued by the Town to hunt rabbit and pheasant has declined. Please note: Any changes to the current by-law will not affect a farmer discharging a firearm for the protection or preservation of livestock or crops on his or her own property.
