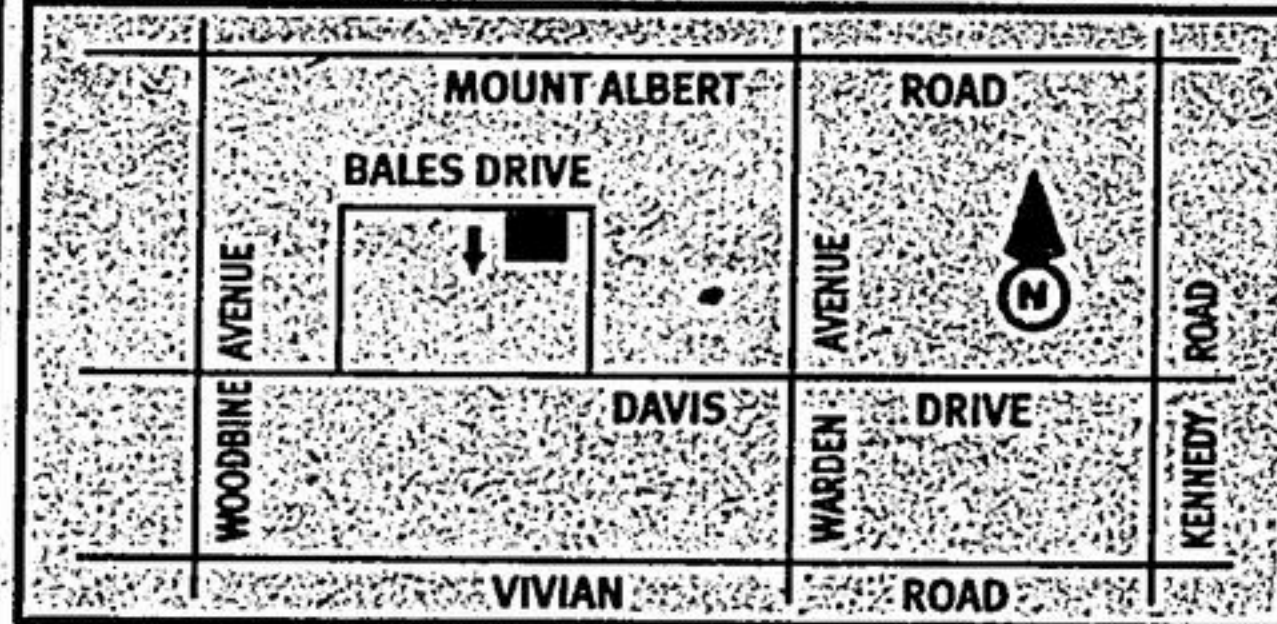

What to do:

1. Look under your kitchen and bathroom sinks, in the medicine cabinet, tool shed, garage and basement. You'll probably find all kinds of cleaners, waxes, detergents, cosmetics, expired prescriptions, solvents, paints, bug killers, oils and grease, etc.
2. Make sure all materials are in original containers or contents are very well marked on containers.
 Do not mix different products together. Be sure that all containers are capped. Please remember that your containers must be deposited with waste materials and are not returnable.

- York Region residents only (proof of residence is required).
- There is no charge for this service.
- No commercial, industrial or medical office wastes accepted.
- No explosives (other than the above types), ammunition, PCBs, or radioactive wastes accepted.
- Needles and syringes from household medicinal use will be accepted in rigid containers only. No other pathological wastes will be accepted.
- Scrap metal, large metal appliances, cardboard, motor vehicle batteries and oil filters will be accepted.
- Tires, regular garbage and yard waste will not be accepted.

- Secure your gas barbecue and other easily removed outdoor items with a chain and padlock.
- Basement windows — a favorite target for younger offenders — should be secured with a metal bar as should any small sliding windows.
- When you go on vacation:
- Use automatic timers to turn your lights on an off to give the impression

someone is home.

- Leave a door key with a trusted neighbor.
- Notify neighbors that you'll be gone and give them details of any persons who will be visiting your home.
- Arrange to have your lawn mowed or snow shovelled.
- Leave a second car in your driveway or have a neighbor park their car in your driveway.

stuffed mail boxes, darkened houses or houses with lights that have been left on too long.

To avoid advertising absences, lawn mowers, snow blowers, barbecues and bicycles are best stored out of sight.

Garden sheds and garages should always be locked and curtains on garage and basement windows are also a preventative measure.

No lock, regardless of its quality, can be truly effective, but key-in-lock knobs provide the least security. Locks should be changed if keys are lost or stolen.

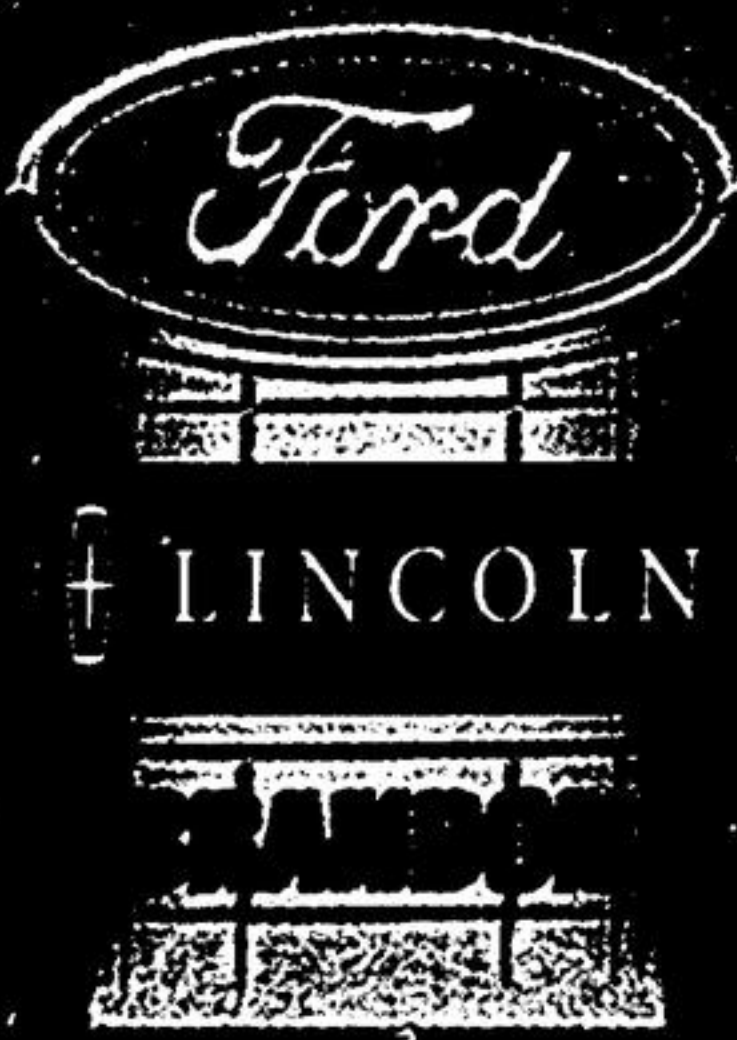
