A country and western entertainer with a 30-year career performing with the likes of Tommy Hunter and The Good Brothers is appearing every Saturday afternoon at Fullerton's Place in downtown Stouffville.

Lou Moore will be performing between 4 and 7 p.m. often with a guest performer. The Main Street pub is one of the few locations in York Region where country music fans can gather. "There is no country music within a 30 km. radius (of Stouffville)," noted the bar's owner, Grant Fullerton.

Lou Moore, backed up by his band, Fathead, recently produced his own CD after years of playing on other people's albums.

The "Lou Moore CD" was co-produced with Gordon Lightfoot's guitar player, Terry Clements, and includes a recitation by Canadian actor Graham Greene, as well as Larry Good on the banjo and bass guitar by Michael McMaster.

Moore met Grant Fullerton when he was his guest performer at Limericks in Richmond Hill, where the country and western performer has been playing for the past seven years.

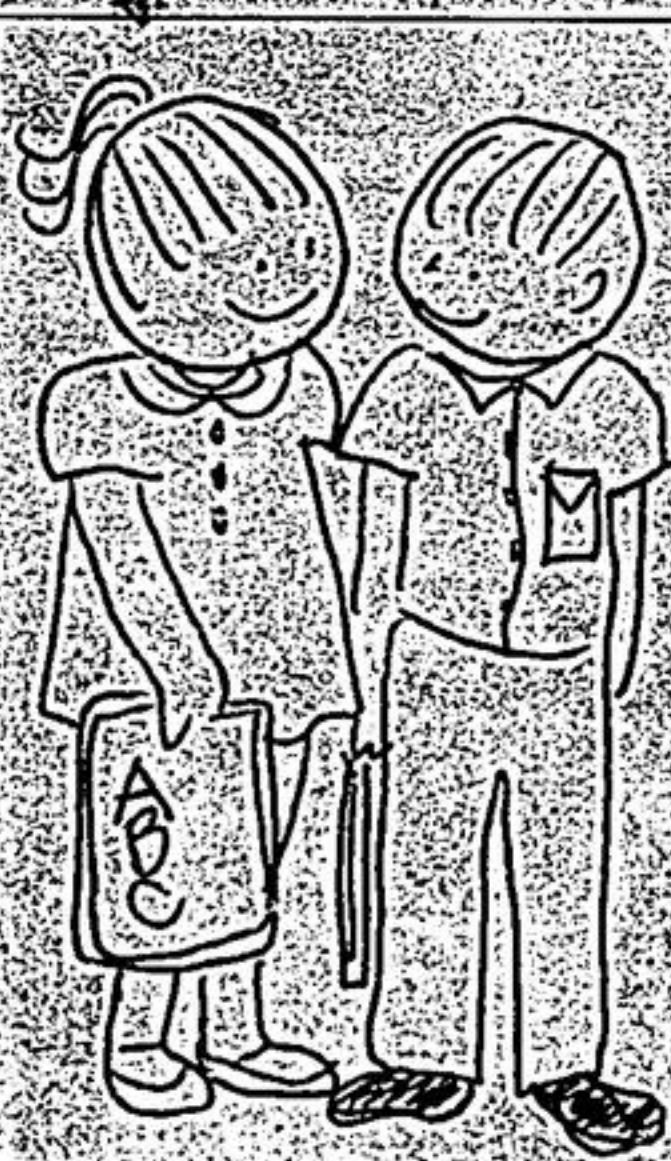
