

# By-election results sending Chretien a clear message

Our cold, un-springlike weather fits Jean Chretien's needs.

The prime minister of Canada should get up early tomorrow morning, pull on his woollies and take a Trudeau-esque walk in the snow.

The results of Monday's seven federal by-elections suggest the prime minister has worn out his welcome. Perhaps not with the Liberal Party of Canada, but with the people of Canada.

Joe Clark's Progressive Conservatives stunned everyone by capturing a longtime Liberal seat in Newfoundland. The riding has been a Grit stronghold since the "Rock" joined confederation in 1949. That's 53 long years.

The New Democratic Party (NDP) swept the Windsor seat held by Liberal Herb Gray for 39 years. Mr. Gray was both a well-respected and a very skilled politician.

When his constituents elected the NDP, it wasn't an anti-Gray vote. Rather, it was an "enough is enough" message directed at Mr. Chretien.

As was expected, newly-selected Canadian Alliance leader Stephen Harper won easily in Calgary.

Mr. Harper becomes the eighth party leader to sit across the Commons from Chretien since the Grits came to power in 1993.

When a federal or provincial party leader runs, Canadians are usually gracious.

They do the right thing, giving the new leader a place to sit. Stephen can now join Joe and Jean to complete the three wise-men pack.

Pierre, Marc and Gerard were on the same Liberal team during the early 1970s. It's too soon to suggest how this trio will compare.

The Liberals did manage to win in the other four by-elections. The Grits aren't surprised at the losses.

They know the people of Canada were a wee bit annoyed when Auditor General Sheila Fraser stated that the government kinda, sorta failed to protect the

public interest in giving its pals \$1.6 million in returns for apparently worthless reports.

The best the government can hope for is people won't be able to figure out what this Mrs. Fraser is going on about.

Let's look at the overall picture. After three majority election victories, Jean Chretien remains the undisputed master of the northern universe.

While the other federal political parties were making jackasses of themselves, the Liberals weren't far behind.

Human nature being what it is, the power-hungry Grits put a great deal of energy into becoming authors of their own misfortunes.

The Liberals jumped on a self-destructive course and they won't get off.

The situation is such that it is time for the prime minister to admit he's held too much power for too long.

Jean Chretien needs to take the trek in the snow and call it a day.
