No losers in this all-night relay race

Hundreds of York Region residents are planning to sacrifice sleep in order to run all night.

Beginning 7 p.m. June 14 and lasting until 7 a.m. June 15, 90 teams of 10 or more will walk, run or jog to raise money for the Canadian Cancer Society in the Relay For Life. The event takes place at the Markham Fairgrounds on McCowan

Rd. at Elgin Mills Drive.

Teams set up a tent at their headquarters and begin to circle the horse-racing track at their own pace. At least one member of each squad should be on the course at all times.

"We hold the race at night because, with many of the cancer patients the participants are running for, this is the toughest time of the day," says event co-ordinator Kathy Craine. "We want to support

them in their darkest hours."

Teams are encouraged to choose a theme and decorate their tents accordingly. Participants can even walk in costumes related to their themes.

This is also the only relay in which the victory lap is done before the run. Cancer survivors are honoured by circling the track just before the event begins.

"Cancer is like a gift wrapped in barbed wire," says team captain and cancer survivor Jacquie Morino. "When you're dealing with the disease you meet so many special people."

Ms Morino was diagnosed with breast cancer January, 1992. The mother of two grown daughters has undergone various treatments over the past decade.

"The toughest part is probably dealing with your family and your own mortality."

Ms Morino currently works for the Hudson Bay company, a national sponsor for the Canadian Cancer Society.

Organizers hope to pass the 12 hours quickly with entertainers like the Not Affiliated Big Band, a 20-member jazz and swing group; Elvis Priestly, an Anglican priest who impersonates "The King"; and acoustic guitar virtuoso Sean Stephens.

The Cancer Society hopes to reach its goal of \$185,000 with the run, an increase of \$80,000 from last year.

New homeowners expecting to move into their Ballantrae Road house next week may have to wait a while after thieves broke in Wednesday and stole all the appliances.

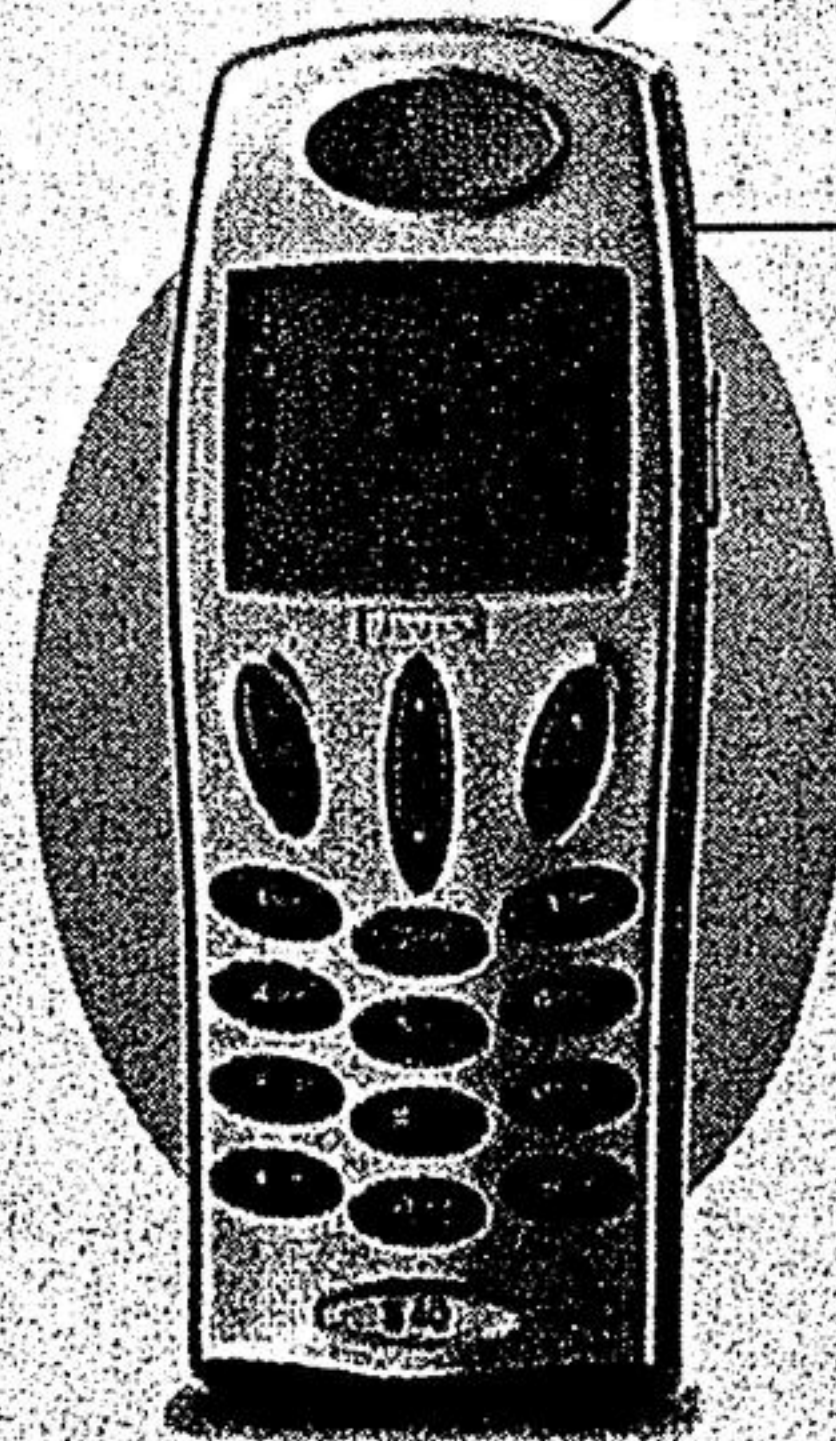
Thugs turned off the water and hydro supply before forcing open a side door.
