DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS BY-LAW

SIGNS AVAILABLE

The Town's by-law to regulate the discharge of firearms within the Town, By-law Number 2001-61-HU, requires hunters to obtain the **written permission** of the landowner or tenant in order to hunt on their property. In order to ensure that hunters know that they are now required to obtain written permission, property owners or tenants are encouraged to post a yellow cautionary signs on their property. The signs should be posted so that they are clearly visible in daylight under normal conditions from the approach to each ordinary point of access to the premises. The yellow signs, which state, "No Hunting on This Property Without the Written Permission of the Owner" are now available from the Clerk's Department of the Town Offices at 37 Sandiford Drive, 4th Floor. The first sign is free of charge and each additional sign will be sold for \$5.90 each.

PART A-WATSON DRIVE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

JUNE, JULY, AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER
