Music Fest Rocks Markham Village

Put on your dancing shoes as this year's Markham Village Music Festival will have you dancing in the streets! The festival will showcase local musicians and feature some popular mainstream acts in a weekend of star-studded events.

It all starts on Friday, June 14 at 6 p.m. when Main St. closes and the party begins — right on the street! See Greg Godovitz and the Anger Brothers, Toronto Soul Revival, Boyce's Road and much more!

Eight incredible bands will entertain and sweep you off your feet. Local restaurants will extend their patios into the street and offer some tantalizing delights for your taste buds.

For the kids, there will be rides, face painting, and balloon sculptures in Morgan Park. At 8 p.m. don't miss the Karaoke competition, as contestants strut their stuff and battle it out for CASH.

Annual Parade

The party continues on Saturday morning with the annual Festival Parade at 10 a.m., starting just south of Highway 7, and travelling north on Main Street up to Parkway Avenue.

Bands, floats, antique bicycles, vintage cars and trucks, and plenty of clowns will add to the excitement.

A Musical Extravaganza!

The street comes alive with seven stages setup throughout the Village featuring free live entertainment — from jazz, rock, R&B and swing.

The festival will take on an international flavour as the Not Affiliated band, Ecuadorian Band, Hawaiian Dancers and the Reggae Band, entertain the crowds with their unique musical genres. Rounding out this musical extravaganza is a showcase of local amateur talent that will com-

pete for stardom and some fantastic prizes. Cheer on your favorite star in the high school rock/pop band competition Battle of the Bands, and the Young People's Music Star Search for young talented musicians and singers, ages 6 to 18. For the more mature performers once again we look forward to the Senior's Music Talent Contest. See the complete schedule for times and locations. There is truly something for everyone!

Crafts, Food and so much more!

More than 100 one-of-a-kind craft and international food booths, will line both sides of Main Street offering antique jewelry, woodwork, clay pottery, birdhouses, specialty clothing, wrought iron and a multitude of one-of-a-kind items.

Local businesses will join the celebration by offering lots of in-store specials.

Plus, the Markham Farmers' Market will be running Saturday morning as usual.

Children's Village

Bring the kids to The Children's Village in Morgan Park (one block east of Main Street) and enjoy great rides, petting zoo and free swimming at Morgan Pool. The rides will be operating from Thursday evening through Sunday.

Shoppers Drug Mart will be there with the Life Bear's Den Maze, a little tykes village, mini-putt, an activity tent with tattoos, colouring and face painting, as well as a Baby Change and Nursing Station.

On Main Street the kids will have a ball meeting the street performers Buttercup, Cricket and Sunshine. The stage at Carson & Weeks, 59 Main Street, will feature Fantasy Fables, Markham Youth Theatre and the incredible Briar Crawford.

There will also be two awesome competitions for teens — the DBS Skateboard Competition, the Markham Scouts Soap Box Derby competition and CyclePath BMX/Mountain Bike demonstration. The Scouts are ready and the heats will start right after the Parade on Saturday at about 11:30 am. The race begins at Main and Robinson and runs west on Robinson. The skateboard competition will take place on Main Street North from 12 noon to 4 p.m. Come cheer them on!
