

computers in every classroom — with a teaching philosophy that places Christianity at the heart of the curriculum.

"Some Christians will shy away from some parts of our culture," Mr. Siebenga said. "We do not. We say that everything that the Lord created is good.

"Human beings have messed it up in a bunch of places, so we will try to figure out how to live Christianly wherever we are. And we'll lead our students into an understanding of what that means."

It's a teaching philosophy gaining interest from parents and not just in York Region. Every year, more and more

students are bused in from as far as 80 kilometres away to attend classes at the Woodbridge school.

In Simcoe County, parents are forming a committee to build a Christian high school of their own.

Next year, 467 students are expected to enroll at Toronto District, up from 250 just seven years ago.

To Mr. Siebenga, the growing interest in Christian schools is understandable, given our increasingly secular society.

"Here in Canada, we've taken the view that religion has to be a private thing," he said.

"But if you pull every acknowledgment of our faith out of our culture, then we will have to go into enclaves and create our own schools so we can pass our

faith on to our kids."

At the same time, he stressed, parents are not sending their children to his school to insulate them from the rest of the world.

"I think (Christian schools) are just as isolated as any other high school," he said.

"The challenge is to help kids develop some kind of perspective on their own lives in this kind of incubation setting."

At Toronto District, that means an emphasis on teaching the students about different points of view, as well as exposing them to the realities of life.

For instance, for several years now
