Markham and Stouffville are planning a chain of events to celebrate the nation's birthday on Monday.

Markham's celebrations start at 3:30 p.m. with a parade organized by the town.

It begins at the intersection of Heritage and McCowan Roads and proceeds along McCowan to Milne Park, located south of Hwy. 7.

This is a people's parade, said town spokesperson Marjorie Rebane, so children are encouraged to decorate their bicycles and join in.

At the park, there will be singing and dancing performances, kung fu demonstrations and steel drum entertainment. The younger set can enjoy arts and crafts, face-painting, games and performances by clowns.

Canada Day events in Stouffville are part of the Strawberry Festival, taking place in or around Memorial

Park. Festivities include bands music, picnic and a celebration with cake at 9 p.m. in Franklin Park Marquee.

Fireworks, of course, are the main attraction in Markham and Stouffville. Stouffville's starts 9:45 p.m. in Memorial Park. Markham's kick off 15 minutes earlier at Milne Park.

Meanwhile, children 12 and younger with teddy bears can ride the York Durham Heritage Railway for free on Monday. For children in Stouffville, bring a teddy bear for a train ride on York Durham Heritage Railway.

The ride leaves 12:30 p.m. from the Stouffville train station on Main Street east of Ninth Line. For more information on the ride, call 905-852-3696.
