

My HRT-free trip through menopause

A study recently released in Detroit suggests I made a smart choice 12 years ago.

Hormone replacement therapy (HRT) deals with medication taken by millions of North American women for relief of menopause symptoms. American researchers are now reporting this medication should not be taken long-term because it carries more risks than benefits.

Replacement medications like estrogen and progestin are very popular. They're being used by about 40 per cent of women during and after menopause.

Studies indicate these women run greater risk of developing blood clots, strokes, breast cancer and heart attacks.

The new message now being delivered is: Women should get back to the basics of controlling menopause with diet and exercise.

While we're back to the basics, we're not reaching back to the past to once again call menopause "the change of life."

It's been years since anyone whispered in my ear, "The poor thing can't help herself. She's going through the change."

I didn't mind menopause. For me, being a little off wasn't all that foreign.

Besides, from where I view the world, what's wrong with having a hot flash?

I'd rather lie in the snow, throw the blankets off, roll down the car window or fan myself than have a stroke.

Why can't we women of 50-plus enjoy a little cry once in a while? We earned it.

If you're old enough, find a box of tissue, sit down in your favourite chair and let the tears fall. If people object, ignore them. They'll

SUMMER SALADS

I marvel at the amount of time our kitchen dwellers spend on making these and how often we make them — sometimes twice daily. I think to myself — why not just in bigger batches, wouldn't it be more efficient? The answer is that the seasoning works on the batch sizes we make — and those are the bowl sizes we have — other than that, if you were home (and had the time) you'd make them daily too — that's the principle of 'Homemade'.

To ponder the alternative, pick up a container of supermarket salad, put your glasses on and read the ingredients! A lot of the additional stuff is not to enhance flavour, but to preserve shelf-life. Note also where it comes from — very often from the U.S.! — and don't think that the salads that they sell in the deli counter in bulk are any different at all. And don't forget to look at the code date — sometimes it's 4 to 6 weeks. Have you ever had a salad last that long in your fridge?

The moral of this little story is that if you want to buy homemade, we're it.
