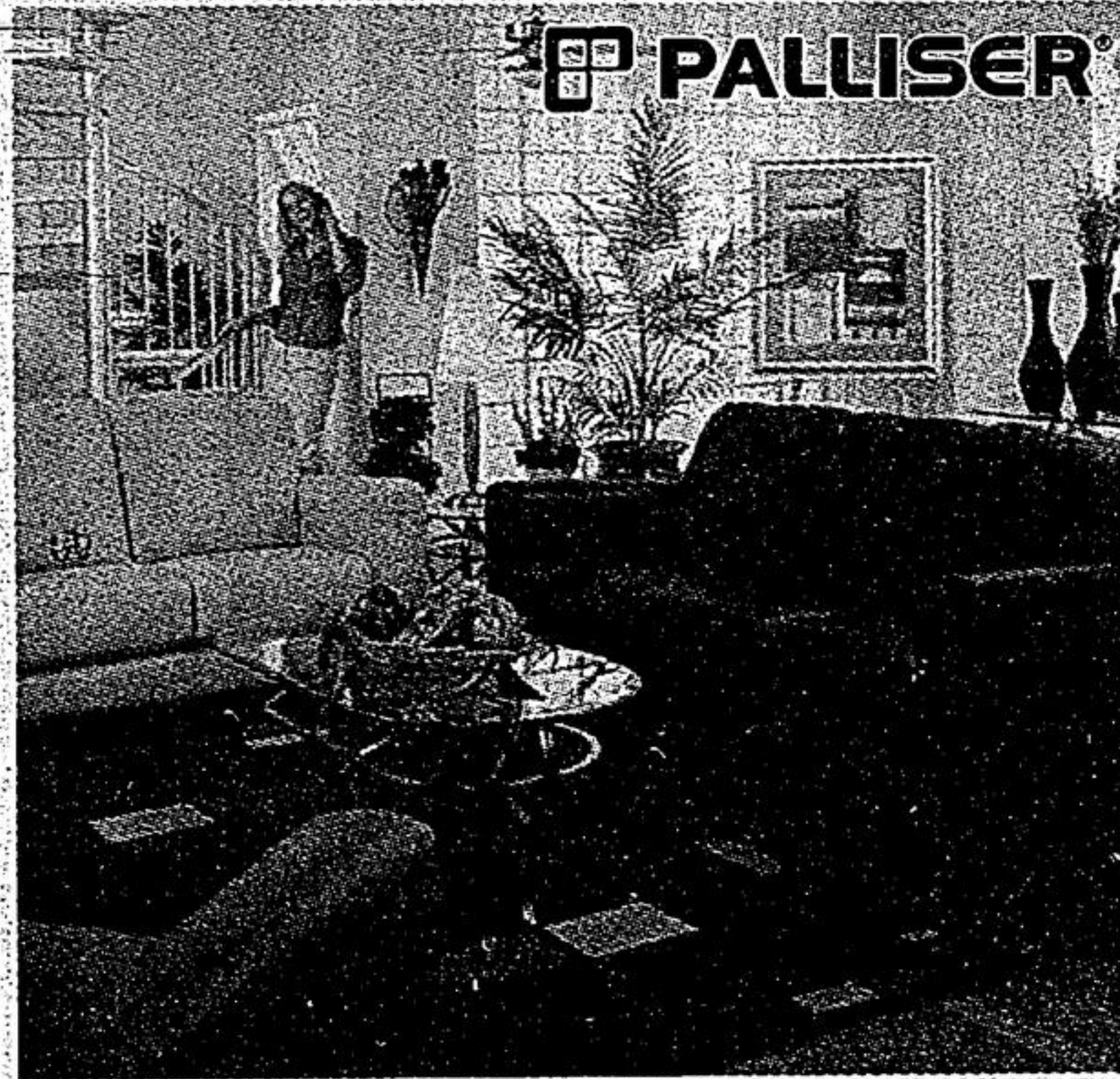

"We are excited about opening an East Side Marios in Whitchurch-Stouffville," said Ms Dipede. "Construction will take about 90 days." The restaurant will be hiring in town. "We always depend on local residents to build our staff," she said.

The 10-acre plaza, located across from West Lawn Crescent, just west of The Lion restaurant, is being developed by Mr. Vong who also owns the

Stouffville Plaza across the street. Negotiations for the old A&P store and the rest of the old plaza are underway now, said Mr. Vong.

Recent change has also come to downtown Stouffville.

The owners of Stouffville Furniture have bought the old IGA store with plans to open a new store in late September. Directly across the street at the former Latham Gallery, Canadian Hedge Funds will open an office soon, while the old Care and Share shop is now occupied by a security business.
