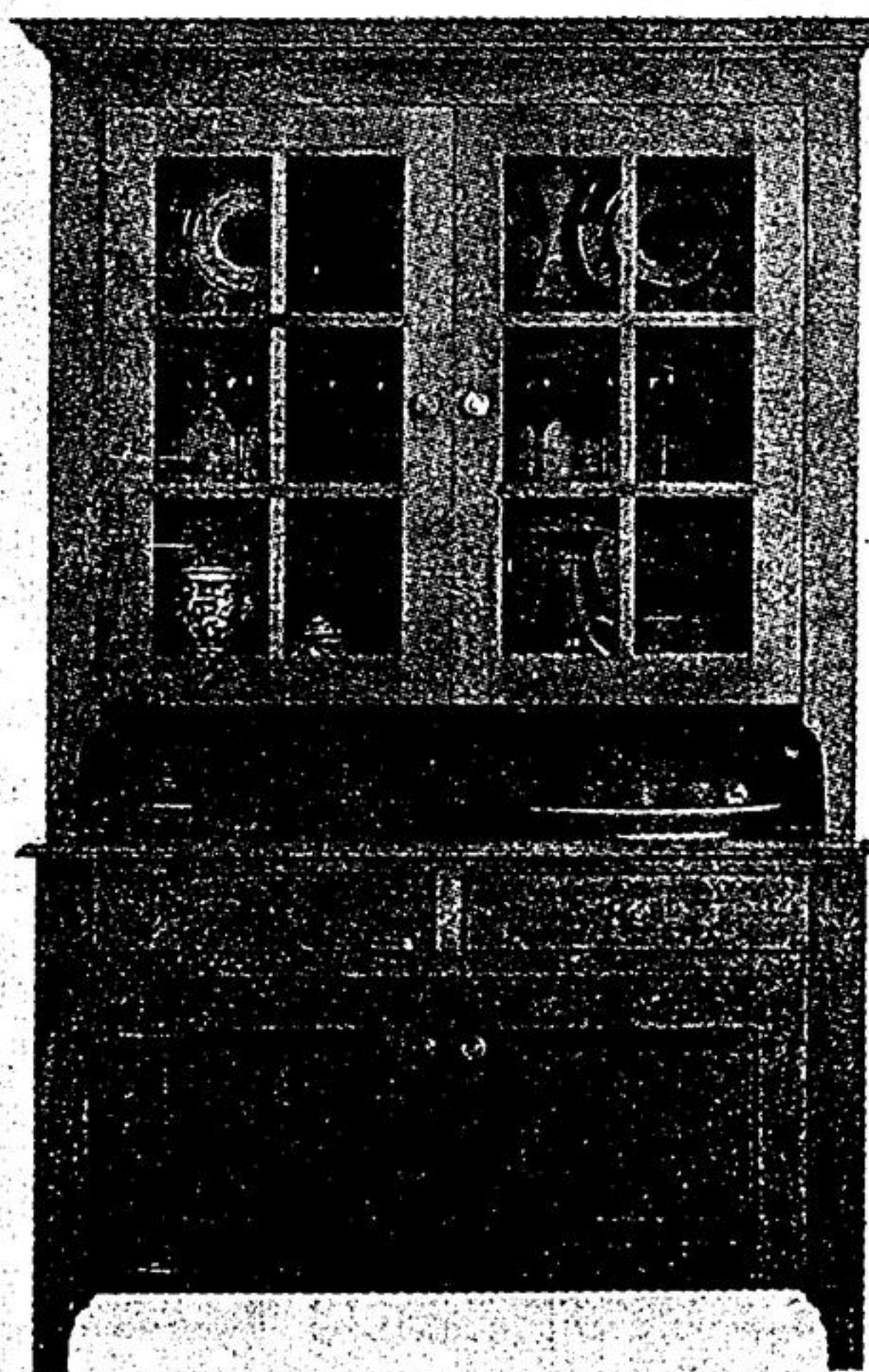

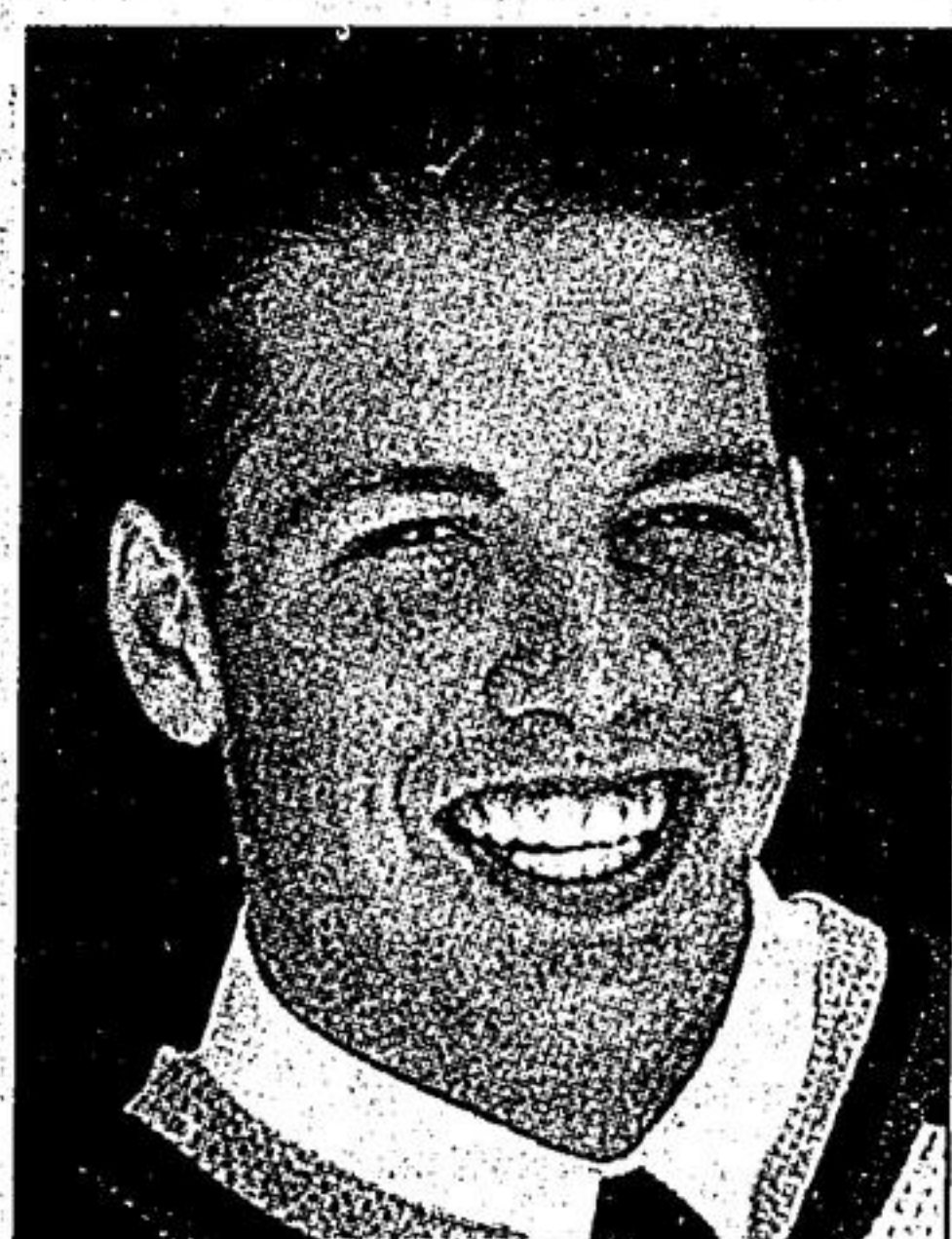

First up are the East Conference cellar-dwelling Ajax Axemen (2-8-1-0) 7:30 tonight at the Stouffville Arena. The Spirit hosts the Newmarket Hurricanes (9-2-0-0) on Saturday at 8 p.m. and the Oshawa Legionaires next Thursday.

The next road contest for the Spirit comes Oct. 27 in North York against the Rangers.

Rookie netminder Steven Carota continued his hot play in both games.

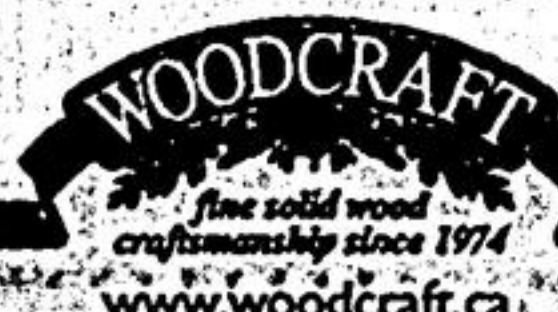
