

Fraud artists pick on local residents

If you're a fraud artist, I have a sucker for you. Allow me to introduce you to Whitchurch-Stouffville. This municipality's a sitting duck for the latest in con lines and sleazy tricks.

A few years ago, the Ontario Provincial Police Phone Busters squad reported a widespread telephone scam operating across the province. Its victims included people from Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Phone Busters issued warnings to residents, especially the elderly. In this fraud, victims were called by a charming gentleman and told they were the lucky winner of a major prize such as a car.

All that was required was to pay the shipping charges in order to transport the vehicle from Montreal to Toronto. Mr. Charm then offers to look after the administrative matters linked to the shipping charges.

The victims were asked to hand over their credit card number, bank account number and/or debit card number. Of course, there was no prize. But there was a surprise. The victim's bank account was drained.

While Phone Busters make some arrests, telephone scammers manage to steal millions of dollars. The elderly are prime targets. They're vulnerable, often lonely and thieves take full advantage.

About three years ago a Stouffville businessman disguised himself as a financial agent, wrapped himself in Christianity and walked off with more than \$4 million of other people's money. David Blow's victims included fellow church goers from Whitchurch-Stouffville. While Mr. Blow did a little time behind bars, none of the money was recovered. His victims were left bitter, sad and, perhaps, wondering about who sits beside them at church.

Last week, Whitchurch-Stouffville residents Sharon and David Baxter learned they were victims of debit card "skimming." York Regional Police's fraud squad says this new type of fraud is at an epidemic level.

Thieves have found a way to steal personal identification numbers (PIN) and are using them to access bank accounts. The bad guys inflate the accounts by making fake deposits, then follow up with real withdrawals. The Baxters

call it being robbed by a "modern day Jesse James".

More than 100 cases of this fraud have been reported in Stouffville and Markham.

The point of compromise is usually gas bars. When keying in your PIN number at the gas bar, a lap top-like box underneath the counter is downloading the debit card information. A new card is made and off the thief goes to make a withdrawal.

If I buy gas from anywhere other than my usual spot at the corner of Ninth Line and Main Street, I'm going to look underneath the counter.

I'm not going to be a victim of fraud for the second time. I'm a product of the old teaching: Fool me once, shame on you. Fool me twice, shame on me. Yes, I've been a victim of fraud.

Six years ago I bought a three-month membership at a fitness centre at Success Plaza in Stouffville.

I was into my fourth week when the owner called to say she had a sell-off, made up of a one-year membership package for \$200. It was a bargain. I visited her immediately and gave her a cheque.

The next morning I arrived at the centre for my one-hour workout, only to find a note stating the centre was closed for the day, "due to a family emergency."

The same note was at the fitness centre the next day. I assumed it was a death of a close family member. Three days later, still no sign of anyone. An alarm bell rang. I started to snoop.

Yes, my cheque had been cashed. I learned the business was bally up and the owner had been evicted. Just before she split, she hit on her members with the sell-off package.

I have no idea how an elderly person feels when robbed of his or her life savings. I only lost \$200. Still, if I ever see that woman, I'm going to sneak up on her and give her a boot in the derriere.
