New-look Latcham Hall 'opens' today

The welcome mat is out at the newly renovated Latcham Hall this afternoon.

The Stouffville Lions Club, which operates the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville facility, is hosting an open house from 2 to 5 p.m.

Lion Don Richards explained

that the recent renovations include new public bathrooms, a wheelchair accessible front entrance and a small meeting room.

The cost of the renovations was approximately \$190,000.

The facility is open to the public to rent out for private parties, club meetings and other events.

There will be refreshments and cookies being offered at the open house.

Latcham Hall is located on Park Drive in Stouffville Memorial Park, south of Main Street.

Areas targeted were schools, the Stouffville Arena and residential properties adjacent to those sites during after-school and evening hours.

That resulted in the arrest of 14 youths and three adults, aged 15 to 18, with more arrests to come as police identify further trouble spots in town.

He said police will also concentrate on Highway Traffic Act charges like speeding and seat-belt violations as well as trespassing offences, as people complain about teens infiltrating public parks.

"They have taken over the

(private) parkette on Ninth Line (at the Stouffville Mews town-house complex, next to the arena), taken over the play structure which is supposed to be for little kids, and the little ones are finding drug paraphernalia and bottle caps."

'It's like they don't care what (their town) looks like or what they do to it.'

Parents of those charged have been notified of the teens' activities, Sgt. Auld

pointed out.

"Most seem on-side, but many still say it's just kids being kids," he said. "But these are public places and the public should be able to enjoy them. I'd like to tell those kids 'it's your town, show respect and loyalty for your own town.' It's like they don't care what it looks like or what they do to it."


He encourages residents who see criminal or intimidating behaviour by young people to alert police by dropping into the Community Policing Centre in the Stouffville Train Station or calling 5 District at 905-881-1221, ext. 7500.
