Growth boom two years away

A 90-home subdivision in the southeast corner of town and a 150,000-square-foot automotive parts plant in Gormley will be the only marked growth in Whitchurch-Stouffville in 2003.

Since the Big Pipe is not expected to be up and running in Whitchurch-Stouffville until 2004, developers will spend the next 12 months dealing with paperwork and getting some servicing for planned subdivisions in place, said Tom Parry, the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville's director of development services.

AWAITING THE BIG PIPE

Growth over the next year or two will not escalate by great numbers. The municipality's population, now standing at 23,800, will increase by about 1,500, Mr. Parry said.

Three months ago, local developer Joe Lebovic was given the go-ahead to build 90 single-family homes on a 20-acre parcel of land on the Ninth Line south. Construction is expected to get underway soon, providing the weather co-operates.

While other developers won't be in a position to dig foundations or bang up housing frames, they could be able to get some servicing work at the housing sites underway, said Mr. Parry.

Mr. Parry said some lot servicing

could at least begin in late 2003 at a 269-home subdivision developed by Frank Mauro Ltd. on 47 acres on the east side of the Ninth Line. This site is located north of Millard Street and Bramble Crescent with access from the Ninth Line and Bayberry Street.

As well, preliminary servicing work by Madori Ltd. could begin in 2003 on a 329-home subdivision on 56 acres on the west side of the Ninth Line near Glad Park School and St. Mark School and church, said Mr. Parry.

The 90 homes to be built in 2003 make up the first phase of Mr. Lebovic's three-phase development. Over the next 10 years, Mr. Lebovic plans to build 2,600 homes on 250 acres on the south side of Stouffville.

Over the next 10 to 15 years, Whitchurch-Stouffville's country flare will give way to a more urban look when 3,500 homes will be built in six new subdivisions.

AUTO PLANT EMPLOYS 200

In the industrial sector, construction will get underway, weather permitting, on Hunjan International. The large automotive parts plant will be built on the southeast corner of Woodbine Ave. and Stouffville Rd. The company, established in 1986, is relocating from Markham.

Hunjan has 200 employees now and has plans to hire about 50 more once the new plant is up and running.
