

## Stouffville tournament titles at stake

The Stouffville Arena will be a busy place for minor hockey action during the Christmas holiday period.

On Dec. 27, the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association Mayor's Youth Games Christmas Tournament will take place.

House league clubs in the tyke, novice and atom divisions will participate in the three-day event, which continues on Dec. 28 and concludes Dec. 29 with the novice championship at 1:55 p.m.

The atom championships will be determined on Dec. 28 with the A division finale at 5:10 p.m. and B division one hour later.

On Jan. 3, Stouffville will play host to a pee-wee-bantam-midget A-level tournament.

Stouffville will have representation in each of the three divisions.

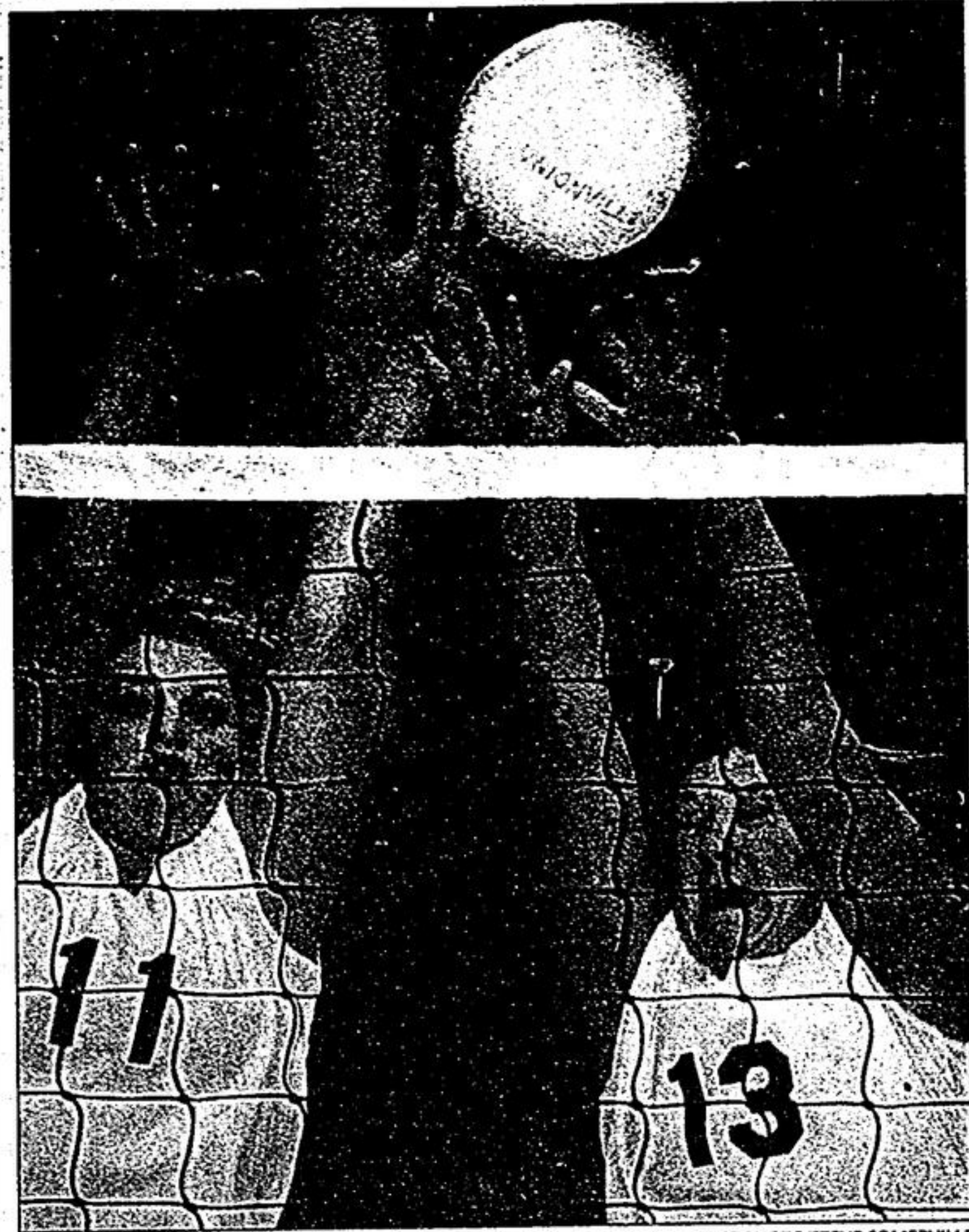
In the pee-wee grouping, the Clippers will compete against Oshawa, Port Perry and Bradford.

In the bantam division, Stouffville will be pitted in one grouping with Newmarket and Scarborough while Bracebridge, Pickering and Port Perry will do battle in the second division.

The 12-team midget field will see three divisions with Stouffville placed in a group that includes South Pointe, St. Catharines and Kitchener.

Round-robin play in each of the age groups will begin Jan. 3 and continue through Jan. 4.

The championship titles will be determined on Jan. 5 with the midgets playing at 2 p.m., bantams at 3:20 p.m. and pee-wees at 4:40 p.m. All of these games will be held on Pad A.
