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Seniors housing, church at market to council today

A 104-home development, designed as a seniors' community, along with a place of worship are both being re-examined by Whitchurch-Stouffville council today.

Neighbours in the Tenth Line and Cam Fella Boulevard area are expected to attend the afternoon council meeting to give the two-fold plan their blessing.

If council agrees, the new seniors' community, made up of cluster style units, and a 750-seat church will be built next to the Stouffville Country Market on the Tenth Line. The 17-acre site is owned by market owner Norm Clements of Uxbridge.

Residents in the Cam Fella Boulevard area are welcoming the new development, said Ward 5 Councillor Harry Bowes.

"This plan be very much like the Eastern Gate development. People like

the design," said Councillor Bowes.

Last summer, Mayor Wayne Emmerson and council braced themselves for opposition to the plan.

However, no one filed a complaint against the application.

Mr. Clements' plan is to build detached bungalow-style homes similar to those at Eastern Gate, also located in east-end Stouffville.

Meanwhile, Stouffville Missionary Church intends to move from its Main Street location, across from Summitview Public School, to the new site. The church parking lot will accommodate 300 vehicles. A soccer pitch is also part of the plan.

Construction could get under way later this year.

New GO Train Layover Facility

Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville and Uxbridge Township

THE STUDY

GO Transit, the Province of Ontario's interregional public transit service for the Greater Toronto and Hamilton areas, has completed the Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) of the New GO Train Layover Facility - Stouffville Corridor. The proposed layover facility site is in the north-east quadrant of the intersection of Highway 47 and Bethesda Road in the Town of Stouffville.

GO is proposing to expand Stouffville train service in response to rapid regional growth in the area. GO needs to begin offering increased service and operating longer trains on the Stouffville line and as a result, a new layover facility will be required.

This Project has been classified as a Group B project according to GO Transit's Class EA Document. The Environmental Study Report (ESR), which documents the planning and design process for the Environmental Assessment will be filed on the Public Record for a 45 day comment period from **Wednesday, January 22 to Friday, March 7, 2003.**
