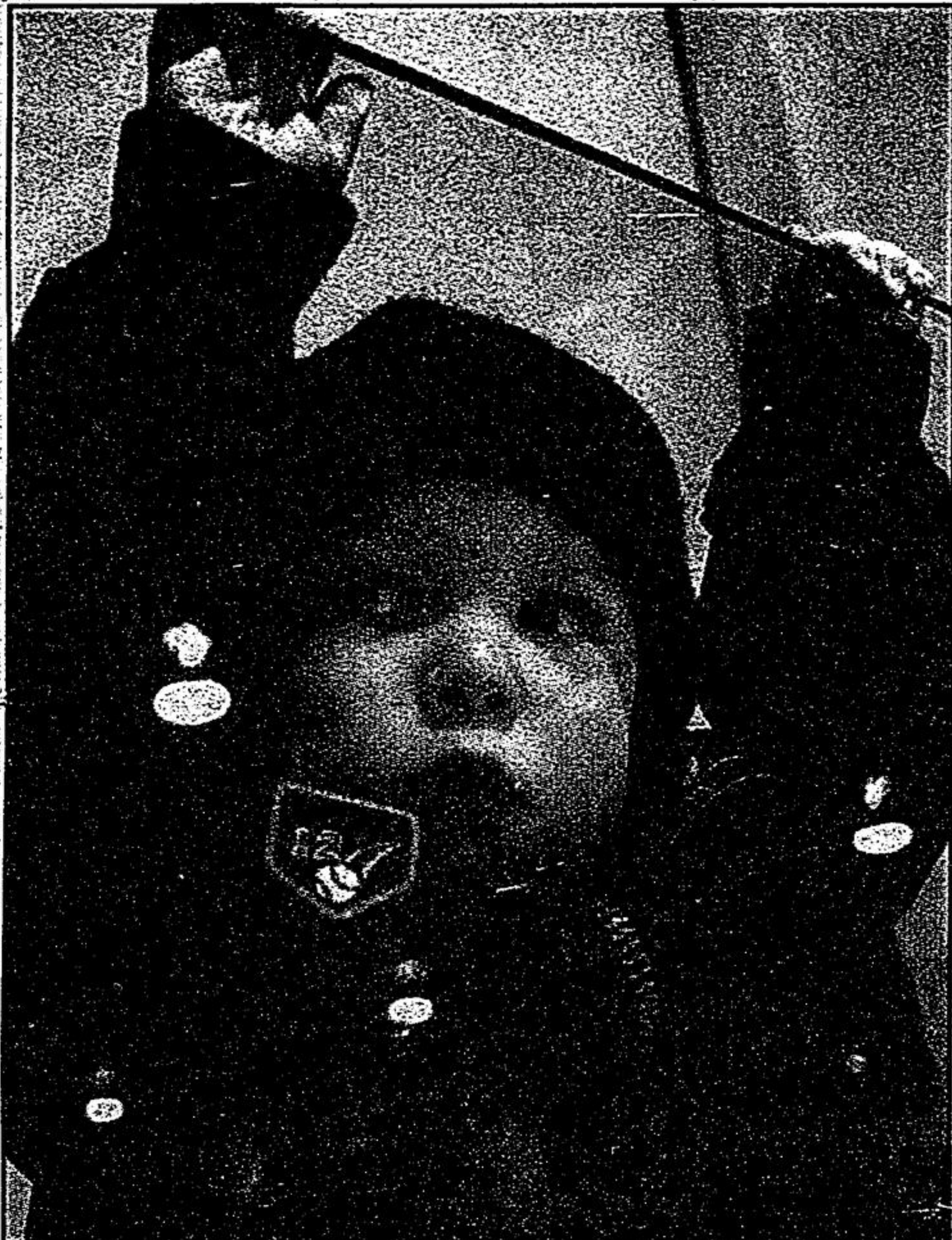


Pat Quinn and the kids were 'Game'

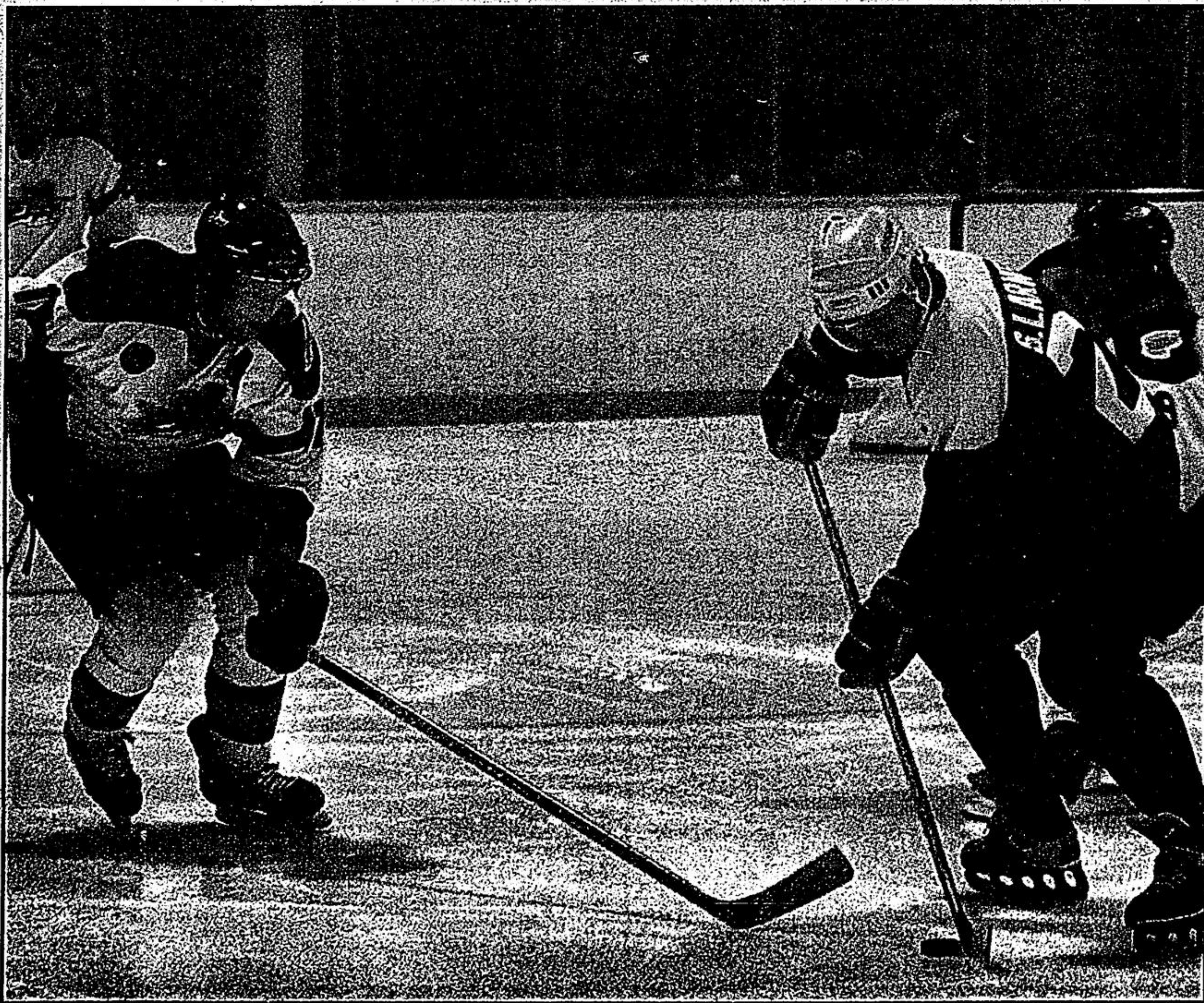


Two-year-old Daniel Montanari has a great rinkside view of Sunday's benefit hockey game at the Stouffville Arena.

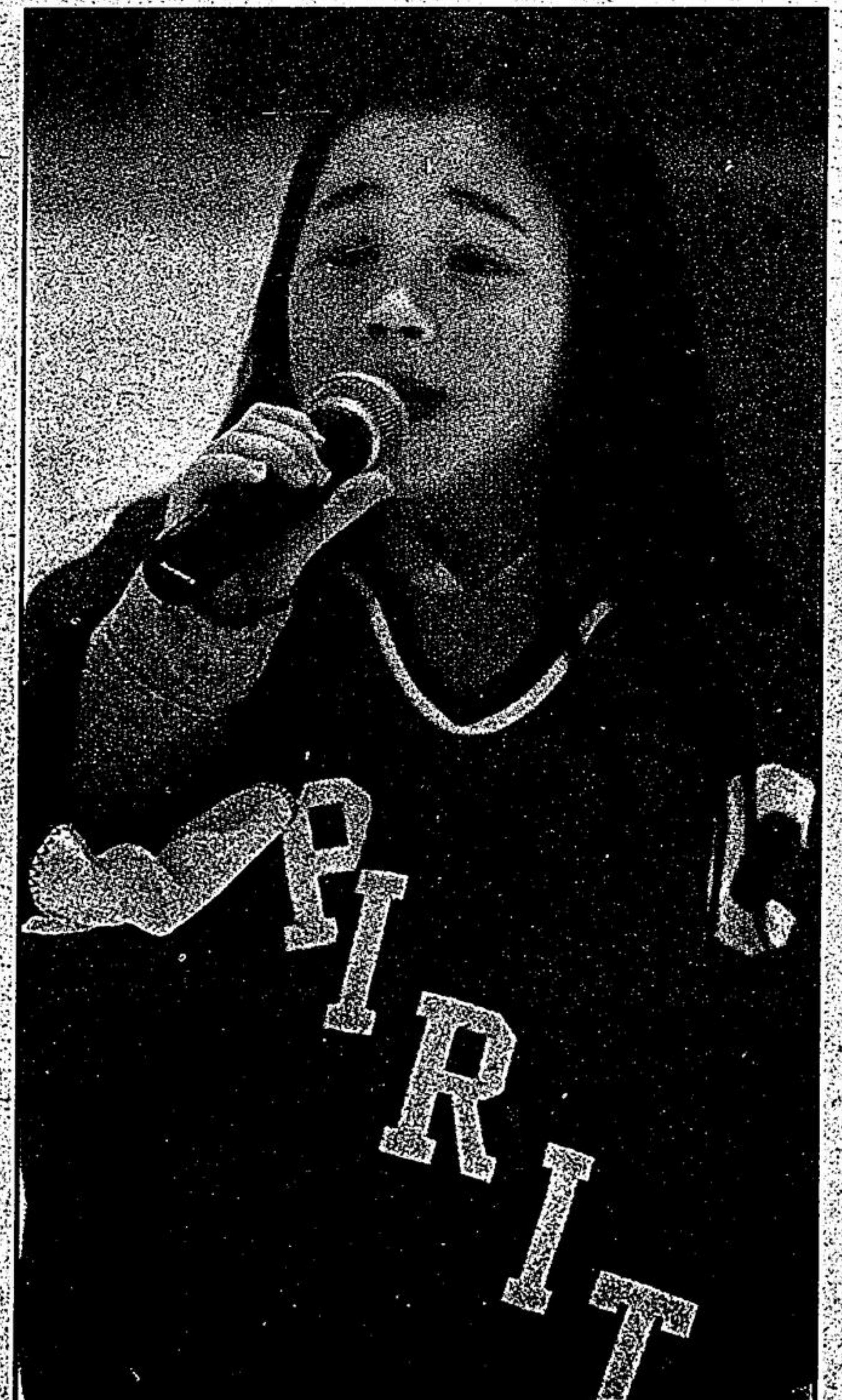
