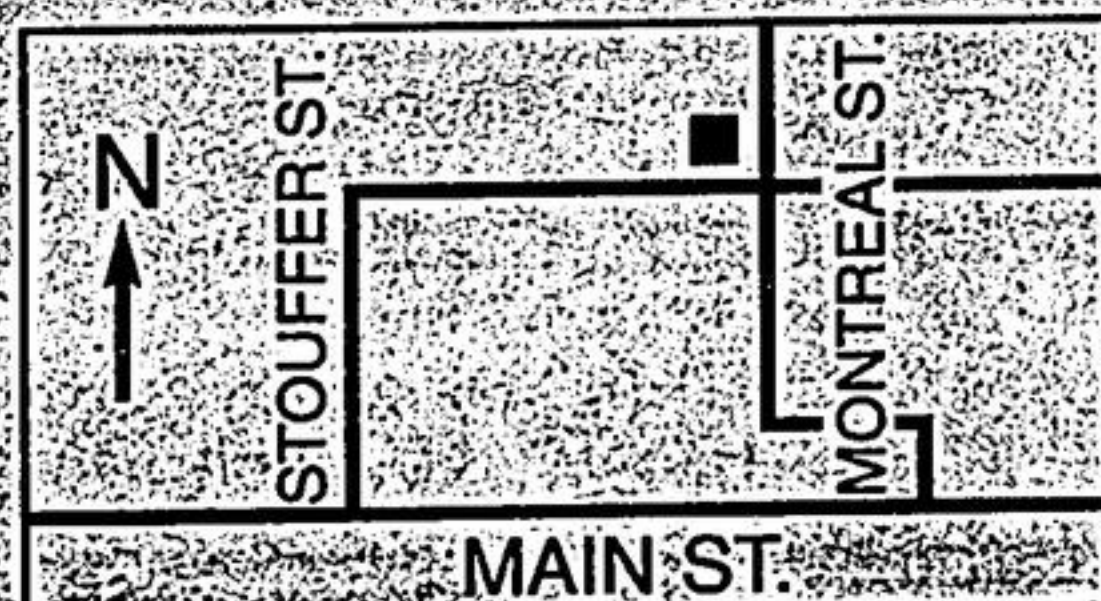

Flaming vehicle may have been carjacked

Police are seeking witnesses to a car fire on the Markham/Whitchurch-Stouffville border early Sunday morning.

Officers found a grey Ford vehicle fully engulfed in flames about 12:30 p.m. on 19th Avenue, just west of the Ninth Line.

The plates identified the car as a rental; investigators are now trying to confirm whether the same car was involved in a carjacking incident in Scarborough the day before.

"Because of the damage to the vehicle, we haven't confirmed yet whether it's the same car," said Const. Steve Morrell. "We are looking for witnesses."

Marching Mennonities have anti-war message

Members of Stouffville's Community Mennonite Church will be among those marching for peace in Port Perry Saturday.

And they're among the Mennonite churches hoping to organize a York Region-wide peace rally later this month.

The sound of their marching feet will echo around the world as people from all parts of the globe take part in peace rallies on the European Day of Action Against War.

The Port Perry Peace Rally starts with a march down Port Perry's Main Street from noon to 1 p.m., followed by speakers, arts and crafts, music and refreshments at the Latham Centre until 3 p.m.

Participants are encouraged to bring posters and banners.

Among the community groups voicing their opposition to war are members of the Stouffville Mennonite Church, which will set up an information booth.

"We are hoping to have as

many people as possible come out," said Pastor Gordon Alton.

Nineteen-year-old Ruth Plett from the Stouffville church and Pastor Pieter Niemeyer of Rouge Valley Mennonite Church in Markham will be among the guest speakers.

Last May, Pastor Niemeyer led a Christian Peacemaker team to Hebron, Israel.

The church's Christian Peacemaker initiative sends people to areas of conflict around the world to listen to local people, report on and take photos of the conflict and "be supportive of those having a peace witness there," Mr. Alton said.

Ms. Plett is the daughter of Stouffville resident Menno Plett, who works for World Relief Canada on projects to alleviate hunger in developing countries.
