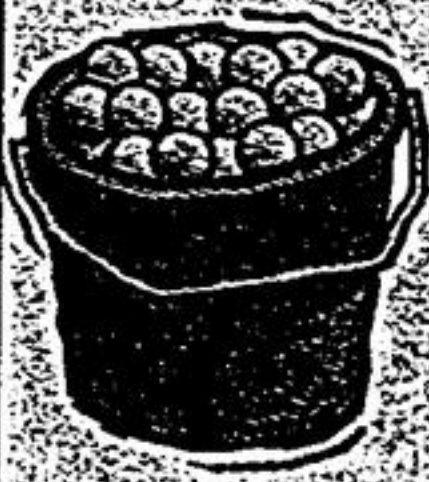

Walk for life raises funds to battle suicide

The number of people who take their own lives in Canada is the equivalent of about 16 jumbo jets crashing every year, according to the Canadian Mental Health Association, York Region branch.

Suicide is the second leading cause of death in Canada for people 10 to 24, according to the Suicide Information and Education Centre.

Two Markham families who lost their sons to suicide are among the organizers of the annual Walk for Life, Walk for Hope event being held May 10 in Markham and Newmarket.

The walkathon will raise money for the Youth Wellness program, sponsored by the York Region branch of the Canadian Mental Health Association.

The program is geared to students throughout the region and focuses on issues such as suicide prevention, teasing and bullying, stress, self-esteem, depression and other mental health problems. It has been expanded to provide support for youths at risk.

Join walk participants at Brother Andre Catholic High School in Markham or at Fairy Lake in Newmarket. Registration starts at 9 a.m., with the walk kicking off at 10 a.m.
