

Residents asked to watch parks

Park Watch, the Stouffville Community Policing Centre's newest program, is enlisting the help of local residents to keep the town's parks safe and enjoyable for everyone.

All that's required is for residents to keep their eyes and their ears open and share information with the police," said York Regional Police Supt. George Kydd. "Be vigilant on what's going on in the parks."

Supt. Kydd is working together with a committee headed by Ward 6 Councillor Sue Sherban, which will be distributing flyers shortly to households surrounding the almost two dozen parks and parkettes in Stouffville.

Information on the program and complaint forms will be included. Residents who see anyone creating mis-

chief or engaging in vandalism in parks is encouraged to fill out a form and drop it into a specially designated slot on the east side of the Stouffville Train Station. The information will be forwarded to York Region Police regularly.

"If you don't let the police know what's happening," Ms Sherban said, "it gets to the point when you have to call 911."

While residents are being asked to be vigilant to make the program work, "We are not asking for people to intervene or to apprehend someone," Supt. Kydd stated. Residents should still call 911 if they deem a situation to be an emergency.

Additional Park Watch forms will be available at the community policing centre.

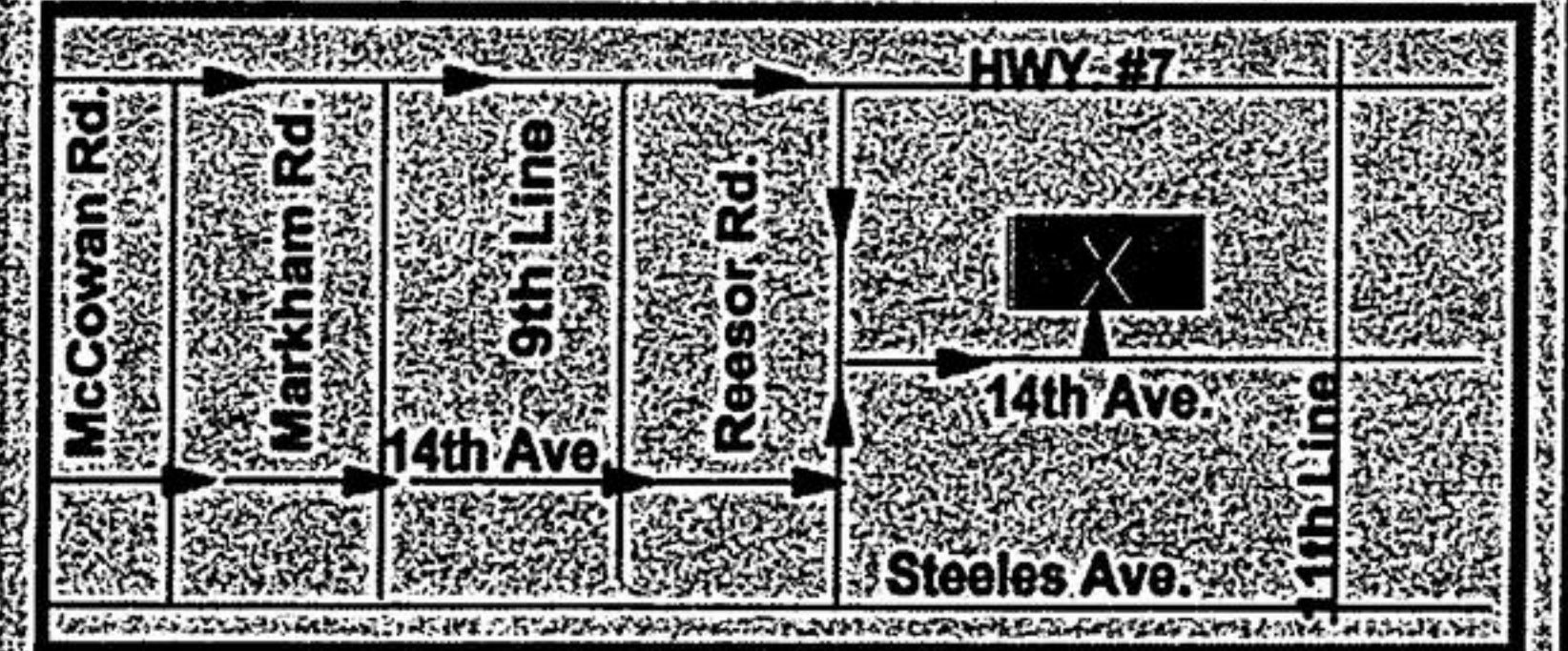
