Bar owner stops break-in

Police responded with canine units and the emergency response team after the owner of the Duchess bar on Main Street in Markham was startled Wednesday morning by a man armed with a knife trying to break in.

The owner chased the would-be robber, then notified police, who converged on the scene just after 8 a.m.

"Where a weapon is concerned, we will dedicate all the resources we can. And it was fresh, the guy was still in the area," said Sgt. Tony Browne.

The suspect is described as male white with spiky hair, wearing baggy pants, baggy jeans and white runners.

One person was taken to the Carlton Road police station for questioning about 11:20.

The investigation is continuing.

Robbery victim chases down suspect

Two robberies occurred in southern Markham within minutes of each other early Saturday.

In the first, a Toronto man delivering pizza to a Steeles Avenue business about 1:15 a.m. was approached by a man armed with a gun. He demanded cash and the driver handed over \$400.

The robber also took the pizza. He's described as a male in his 20s, with a dark complexion, five-foot-10 inches tall and weighing 150 pounds.

In the second incident, only minutes later, a 20-year-old Markham man was walking home, crossing Birchmount Road near Highgate Drive, when a vehicle passed him, flashing its lights.

The occupants yelled something, but the victim didn't hear. Seconds later, three people approached him demanding cash and clothing, which the victim handed over.

After the robbers fled, the victim went home, jumped in his car and chased the suspects down. He caught a man and held him until police arrived. Two others have since been charged.

All three, 17-year-olds from Scarborough, are charged with robbery.
