Transport Canada Hosts Open House on Proposed Zoning Regulations for Pickering Airport Site

The proposed Pickering Airport Site Zoning Regulations will be published in the Canada Gazette, Part I, on April 12, 2003, and April 19, 2003.

Airport Zoning Regulations (AZRs) are enacted in accordance with the federal *Aeronautics Act* to ensure that development of the land adjacent to and in the vicinity of an airport or airport site, is undertaken in a manner that is safe for aircraft operations. The AZR process represents prudent long-term planning so that if demand dictates, a safe and viable airport remains an option for local interests. It does not imply that a decision to proceed with an airport has been made.

Transport Canada invites you to find out more about the proposed Pickering Airport Site Zoning Regulations by attending an Open House on Tuesday, May 27, 2003, 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Pickering Recreation Complex, 1867 Valley Farm Rd., Pickering, Ontario or Saturday, May 31, 2003, 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Claremont Community Centre, 4941 Old Brock Rd., Claremont, Ontario.
