BYLAW ENFORCEMENT

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY WEEDS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter W.5, Sections 3, 16 and 23 that unless the noxious weeds or weed seeds growing on their lands within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville **are destroyed by June 15th, 2003** and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Council of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has appointed a Weed Inspector to cause said weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such manner as he may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Municipality against the respective lands concerned and that such amount shall be collected in the same manner as taxes.

Although Dandelions, Burdock and Goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds with the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville under the Weed Control Act, the co-operation of all citizens is solicited in the elimination of these nuisance weeds.

The co-operation of all persons concerned is earnestly solicited.

WATER RESTRICTIONS

FOR THE COMMUNITIES OF STOUFFVILLE,
BALLANTRAE AND MUSSELMAN LAKE
WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

SECTION 1

1.1 No person shall use the municipal water of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville from a hose, pipe, sprinkler or permanent water irrigation system for the purpose of watering any lawn, garden or the washing of vehicles, sidewalks or driveways or the filling of swimming pools except as follows:

- An **EVEN** numbered address may use water outdoors **ONLY ON EVEN NUMBERED DAYS** of the month;
- An **ODD** numbered address may use water outdoors **ONLY ON ODD NUMBERED DAYS** of the month;
- Outdoor water use is only permitted between the hours of 6:00 am to 10:00 am and 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm.** This use of municipal water from a hose, pipe sprinkler or permanent water irrigation system outside these periods is a contravention of the by-law.
- That these conditions be in place between May 15th and September 30th of each year;**
- Exemptions to these restrictions are provided in Schedule "A"

SECTION 2 - STAGE 1 OUTDOOR WATER USE ADVISORY

- Where the Director of Water and Wastewater of York Region gives notice that a Stage 1 Outdoor Water Use Advisory is declared, all persons will be requested to refrain from using municipal water from a hose, pipe, sprinkler or permanent irrigation system for the purpose of:
 - watering lawns and gardens;
 - washing vehicles, sidewalks or driveways;
 - filling of swimming pools

2.2 Exemptions to the Stage 1 restrictions are provided in Schedule "A"

STAGE 2 OUTDOOR WATER USE BAN

- Where the Director of Water and Wastewater of York Region gives notice that a Stage 2 Outdoor Water Use Ban is declared, no person shall use municipal water from a hose, pipe, sprinkler or permanent irrigation system for the purpose of:
 - watering lawns and gardens;
 - washing of vehicles, sidewalks or driveways;
 - filling swimming pools

SCHEDULE "A" Exemptions and Special Cases

Exempted Users

- The provisions of the By-law shall not apply to persons who owns, operates or carries on the following operations, which rely on the steady supply and use of water:
 - nurseries
 - all weather playing fields, if failure to water will result in a permanent loss of plant material or adversely affect public safety;
 - washing exterior building surfaces, including windows, parking lots, driveways or sidewalks prior to the application of a product such as paint, preservative, stucco or the preparation of a surface prior to paving or rejoining of bricks, or if required by law to comply with health and safety regulations
 - commercial car washes and car dealerships
 - Town operated recreational facilities
 - other uses as identified by the Town from time to time.

All Users

- A person during a Stage 1 Advisory or Stage 2 Ban, may water flowers, shrubs, tree or vegetables on days other than and including their designated watering day, provided the watering is done using a hand-held container.
- A person may water new trees and shrubs during installation and for 24 hours following planting. Any subsequent watering must comply with the provisions of this By-law.
- A person may water new sod or seed for up to one month following planting.
- A person may refill a backyard residential pool for maintaining the integrity of the filtering system.
