

Mennos lose first two of fastball season

The Stouffville Mennos suffered their first two losses of the Oshawa and District Fastball League season last week. Playing host to the Oshawa Heat last Wednesday, the Mennos dropped a 4-1 decision.

Scott Eyre scored the lone Stouffville run in the sixth inning with a solo homer.

Despite surrendering just six hits and striking out five batters, Paul Boynton took the loss.

Travelling to Mount Albert Thursday, the Mennos were edged 4-3.

Chris Burkholder scored the first Stouffville run in the first inning with a single and advancing to third on two Mount Albert errors and scoring on a single by Eyre.

In the fourth inning, the Mennos received back-to-back solo homers from pitcher Byron Baranieski and Dan Deeks.

The two losses dropped the Mennos' record to 4-2.

After yesterday's home game against Stouffville Jones Pools, the Mennos will play in Markham Monday against the Majors at Centennial Park starting at 8:30 p.m.

Stouffville Jones Pools lose and tie

The Stouffville Jones Pools entry fielded a loss and tie in two Oshawa and District Fastball League games last week.

Mickey Finns, however, retaliated with four runs in the second inning and one in the fifth to take a 5-1 lead.

Stouffville closed the gap to 5-2 in the fifth inning when Timms dou-

bled and scored on a single by Nick Dambrosio.

In the sixth inning, Stouffville tied the game on a two-out, three-run homer by Dambrosio.

With no further scoring after one extra inning, curfew was called to end the contest at 5-5.

The Regional Municipality of York is continuing with its Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study to determine a preferred alignment for a new watermain and preferred location for a reservoir to supply water to northern Markham. This study is being undertaken to meet future water supply needs in Markham created by population and employment growth.

The Class EA process is nearing completion, and a recommended watermain alignment and reservoir location have been selected. The watermain is proposed to be constructed within the right-of-way of McCowan Road from Major Mackenzie Drive north to the reservoir, which is proposed to be located southeast of the intersection of McCowan Road and Stouffville Road (See figure). To provide details on the study, recommended watermain alignment and reservoir location, as well as to receive input and answer questions from interested parties, a second Public Information Centre will be held:

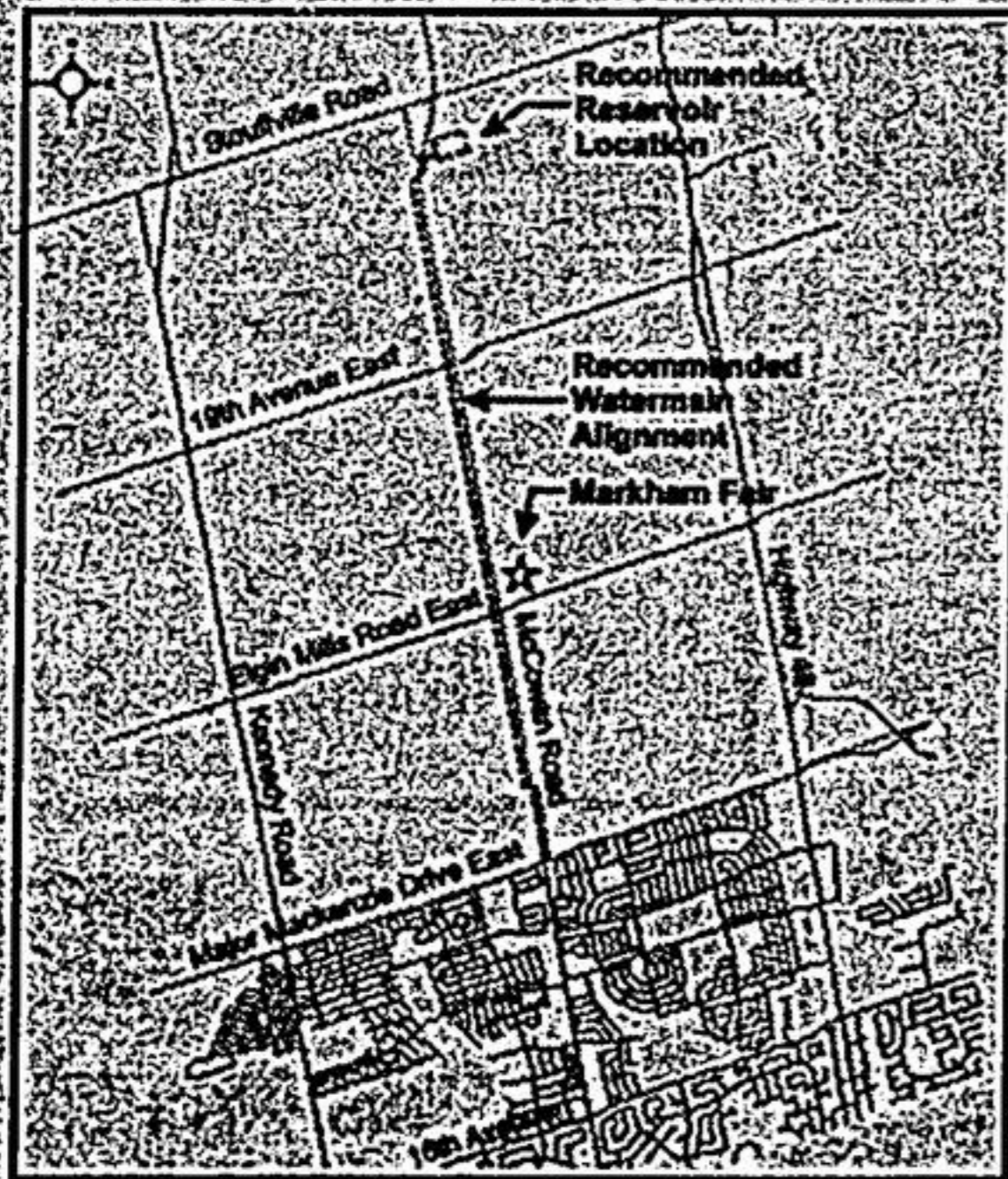
