

Impaired charge laid after car flips in downtown Stouffville

A 62-year-old Stouffville woman faces impaired driving charges after a car rolled in downtown Stouffville early Saturday evening.

The driver lost control of a 1994 Hyundai while southbound on Albert Street, a few metres from Main Street.

The car mounted a guide wire and flipped over, pinning the driver inside, York Regional Police Const. Steve Morrell said.

Whitchurch-Stouffville firefighters used the jaws of life to free the woman from the wreck. The driver, the sole occupant of the vehicle, was

taken by ambulance to Lakeridge Health Centre in Uxbridge, where she was admitted with non-life-threatening

injuries. A woman was charged with impaired driving. She's scheduled to appear in a Newmarket court June 30.

YORK RAPID TRANSIT PLAN MARKHAM NORTH-SOUTH LINK ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

PUBLIC CONSULTATION CENTRE

As one of the fastest growing municipalities in Canada, York Region is facing a number of transportation challenges. A top priority of the Region is to ensure swift and effective action to improve the movement of people and goods. In response to these transportation challenges, the Region has initiated the York Rapid Transit Plan (YRTP) to develop a rapid transit network in York Region. As part of the plan, studies are being undertaken in two major transit corridors and two connecting links to Toronto: the Highway 7 Corridor, the Yonge Street Corridor, the Vaughan North-South Link and the Markham North-South Link.

To "Make the Right Connections!", the Markham North-South Rapid Transit Link EA is examining a corridor extending between Markham Centre and the Sheppard Subway in the City of Toronto. The first step in the EA process was to prepare a Need and Justification Study and subsequently a Terms of Reference to define the scope of the Individual Environmental Assessment. Draft versions of these documents have been circulated to various government agencies and will be formally submitted to the Ministry of Environment for public review in the next month.

The Terms of Reference identifies several north-south rapid transit routes for further investigation, generally including Warden Avenue, a north-south Hydro corridor, Rodick Road and Woodbine Avenue north of Steeles Avenue and Don Mills Road, Highway 404 and Victoria Park Avenue south of Steeles Avenue. East-west connections will also be investigated.

You are invited and encouraged to attend an upcoming Public Consultation Centre to express your views on potential routes and alternatives for Rapid Transit in the Markham North-South corridor. Your input will help guide the Individual Environmental Assessment to be completed in the coming months. The scope and success of this study depends very much on public input and participation.
