The pool will reopen on Sept. 6 to its regular schedule. In the meantime, the outdoor pool will stay open until Labour Day.

Anyone with a membership card can use it at the outdoor facility.

It will take about a week to scrub the pool's tiles and grout and check all the equipment, including the slide. Refilling and heating the pool and balancing the chemicals will take about another week.

Many municipalities close their pools annually for maintenance, said Tom Graham, the town's director of leisure services. Since Stouffville's pool is still new, it's slated to be closed every two years for maintenance.
