

Mennos downed in league tournament semifinals

The Stouffville Mennos advanced to the semi-finals of the recent Oshawa City and District Fastball League's annual championship tournament in Oshawa before they were eliminated 11-2 by Mount Albert.

Buoyed by home runs from Jeff Boadway and Rich Burkholder, the Mennos began the tournament with a 3-2 win over the Stouffville Jones Pools midgets.

Paul Boynton scattered six hits and struck out three to earn the win.

The Mennos' bats came to life in their second outing as they pounded out 15 hits en route to a 14-0 win over the Markham Majors.

Jeff Gayman collected three hits while Burkholder had a triple and double. Terry Reesor allowed just two hits to post the win.

The Mennos then suffered their

first loss of the double knockout event with a 1-0 setback against the eventual tournament champion Claremont Rebels.

The Mennos stranded nine runners, including six in scoring position. Boynton, who was named the league's most valuable pitcher for the season, took the loss.

The loss put the Mennos up against Mount Albert.

Macri finishes sixth on Denver track

Jonathan Macri drove his NTN Bearings Swift to a sixth-place finish at last weekend's Toyota Atlantic Centrix Financial Grand Prix series race in Denver, Colorado.

The 21-year-old Gormley resident began the race in 10th place. He remained there until the 30th lap of the 37-lap event, when he took advantage of rivals' errors to move into sixth place.

"I really tried hard to remain consistent throughout the race and that eventually allowed me to benefit from the mistakes of others," Macri said. "I was able to move ahead without getting caught up in the spots where we were all choked up after yellow flags."

Macri moved into fourth place in the overall series standings with 134 overall points. He is six points behind Michael Valhante of Burnaby, B.C.

Round 12 of the series, which is the final event of the season, takes place Sept. 28 in Miami, Florida for the Grand Prix Americas.
