Whitchurch-Stouffville mayoralty candidate Steve Pliakes will hand over all financial campaign donations to a local charity.

After reviewing the overall community need, Mr. Pliakes has chosen the Parkview Home Building Fund as the recipient to the various donations being made to his election campaign. "I will assume 100 percent of the cost of my own campaign and pass over all donations, including those from developers, to the Parkview Homes Building Fund," said Mr. Pliakes. "The new and improved Parkview Home will be valued at \$16 million. It will be built on the Ninth Line within the next four years.

The plan includes a \$3-million fund raising campaign which was spearheaded by the Parkview Services for Seniors. So far, \$1.5 million has been raised in the community. The fund raisers are at the half-way mark now," said Mr. Pliakes.

"Another \$1.5 million is needed. This is a very important facility. I am more than pleased to be involved." Ours is an aging society. Mr. Pliakes reminds everyone "Dementia touches and will touch many families in Whitchurch-Stouffville," he said.

In keeping with the standards, the new Parkview facility will offer small, home-like settings for its residents. This design, especially, pleases Mr. Pliakes. "As a registered non-profit charitable institution, Parkview Home has already played a major role in the community.

After all is said and done, a community is assessed on how it looks out for its less fortunate, including its aging population. Mr. Pliakes said "Parkview Home Building Fund needs this money more than I do. Passing all campaign donations over to Parkview Home is the right thing to do."
