as a serious contender in a leadership contest. Mr. Klees has held two cabinet posts, including transportation; he has been chief government whip and deputy house leader, while four years ago, he strongly considered entering the race for the Reform Party of Canada.

Thursday night's election win marks his third straight victory to the Ontario legislature.

Other leadership hopefuls include former enterprise minister Jim Flaherty (Ajax-Whitby), former consumer and business services minister Tim Hudak (Erie-Lincoln), and former tourism minister Cam Jackson (Burlington), who all retained their seats despite the Liberal landslide election night.

Out of the race for party leader is former health minister Tony Clement who went down to defeat.

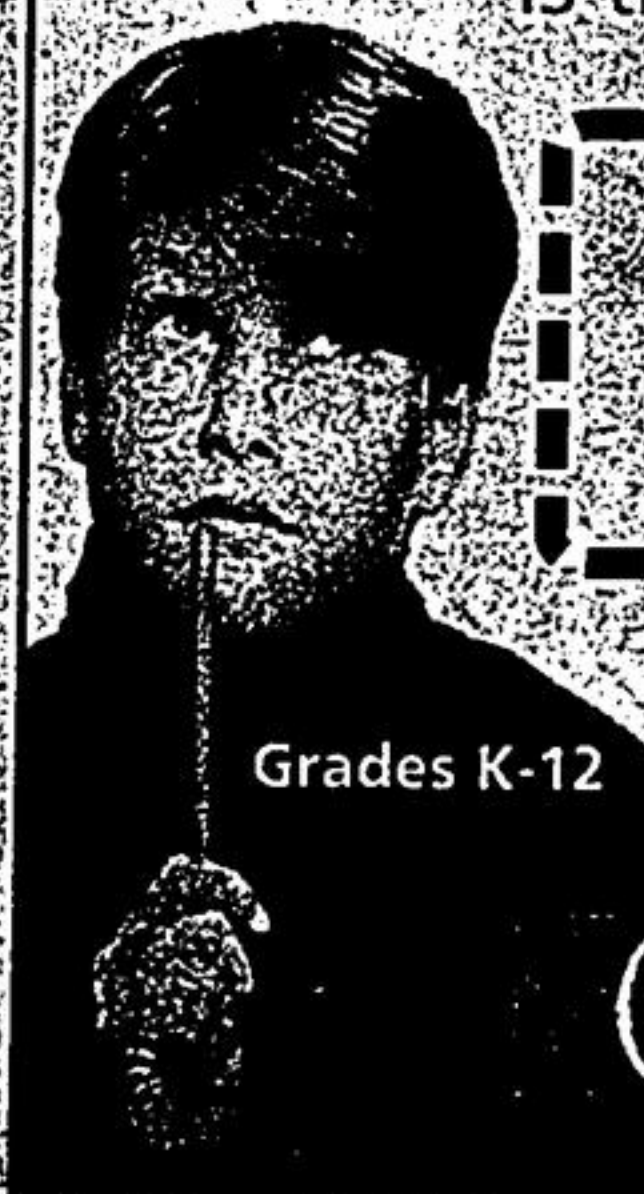
