OHL hat trick for Hughes

Stouffville's Bobby Hughes Jr. picked a good time for a breakout night in the Ontario Hockey League.

The rookie centre scored his first three OHL goals Friday to lead the Kingston Frontenacs to a 5-1 win over the Belleville Bulls at the Kingston Memorial Centre.

Hughes was named first star of the game. Two of his goals were shorthanded.

The 15-year-old was taken by Kingston in the third round of this year's OHL draft.

Last season, Hughes had 58 points in 32 games with the Mississauga Rebels minor midgets.

Spartan girls field playoff berth

The Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans girls' field hockey team assured itself of a berth in the York Region Athletic Association playoffs by defeating Newmarket's Dr. J.M. Dennison 2-0 Wednesday.

The win improved the Spartans' record to 3-2 and placed them in the fourth and final playoff spot with one regular season game remaining. Cindy Schickedanz scored twice for the Spartans.

Spartans head coach Scott Croucher thinks his team is peaking at the right time.

"The team is starting to come together," he said. "Last year we had 35 girls on the team and tried to play them all. This year we've got around 20 and we're

working with a core of players. We're getting stronger as we're going along."

What Croucher likes about this year's team is balance.

Unlike last year's team which relied upon one or two players, this year he says the scoring is spread out.

"We have some quick forwards and a solid defence and they're steady. They know how to react and communicate," he said.

The Spartans' final regular season game is Wednesday when they face first-place Dr. G.W. Williams Secondary School of Aurora.

Croucher noted this game could be a possible first-round playoff preview as the first-place team faces the fourth while second faces third.

Disappointing ending for Taws

It wasn't the way Ashley Taws wanted to finish her 2003 racing season.

But when the 19-year-old Whitchurch-Stouffville resident took to the track for the recent final Canadian Formula Ford Championship series race at Mont-Tremblant, Quebec, she spun off the track and into a gravel trap during the final lap and ended up in 14th place.

For Taws, the end result spoiled a good performance as she had driven her Be Anything With Barbie race car up into fourth place after being back as far as ninth before spinning out in the 15-

lap event.

"I drove a good race, but it was tricky because the car was hydroplaning a lot," said Taws, who was driving under adverse weather conditions. "The heavy rain caught me out on the last lap. When I braked, the back wheels locked for an instant and the car spun around."

Despite competing in just five of eight races this season after recovering from a serious automobile injury incurred late last year, Taws finished seventh in the 2003 championship standings.
