# Mobility Transit makes pool more accessible

A specialized lift to help more people enjoy the therapeutic pool at the Lebovic Leisure Centre should be ready for use within the next few months.

The \$20,620 bill for the pool lift is being paid by Whitchurch-Stouffville Mobility Transit from funds raised through the sale of GO Transit tickets. The lift is being manufactured in England to the pool's specifications.

The specialized lift will allow the town's leisure services department to

make the pool accessible for more severely disabled people who need one-on-one support, said Micole Ongman, the department's recreational program director.

"The need is there," she added. Programs for special needs residents run Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings. The department wants to expand its services with programs such as daytime swims for physically or mentally challenged children.

The pool lift isn't Mobility Transit's only contribution to make life easier for those with handicaps. The organization donated funds for a reader for the visually impaired at the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library. It will donate \$25,000 to the Parkview Home building fund and has already committed \$5,000 to the Stouffville Rotary Club for renovations to the grandstand in Memorial Park's ball diamond to make it wheelchair accessible.

**TAKE BACK OUR TOWN FROM DEVELOPERS**

Return to democracy with the 7:00 Council meeting and a Referendum on Population quota.  
Review all subdivision plans in light of the Oak Ridge Moraine Conservation Act, Act 36 (Walkerton), our Secondary Plan, and our needs.

We will petition that the Ontario Municipal board be taken out of the hands of the developers.  
Monitored slow growth (as prescribed in our Secondary Plan) to preserve our small town character and allow new residents to assimilate with that character.

Disallow any development in Open Space/Environmental areas (Harper-Hoover woodlots, our hedgerows etc.)  
Regulate the hours of construction between 8 AM and 5 PM, five days a week to ensure our serenity and sleep. Explore the possibility of another warning system beside the Backup Beeper.

**A HEALTHY TOWN**

Soft running track to save our knees and backs.  
Revitalization of our historical downtown area by the restoration of the Old Townhall Theatre coordinate summer festivals with the Moraine Train, historical tours (historical plaques) costumed student guides, summer Theatre groups performing at the Old Townhall Theatre.  
A videotaped history of our town to be shown at our schools.  
Regulate our Western Approach Area (no more donuts).  
A Youth Centre with internet cafe, sports facilities and involving a Community Radio Station.  
Expand Youth orientated programs exploring our unique features and cleaning and maintaining our environment. More concerts and outside dances.  
Explore the needs of our Seniors as to transportation, facilities and find a suitable home for the Silver Jubilee Club.  
We will continue with the Mayor's Golf Tournament (Link the Links and Putt your Way across Town) and many of our present celebrations and find new ways to celebrate our Holidays together. (The Celebration of Stouffville).

**TOWARDS THE FUTURE**

For the price of cleaning one pond (\$60,000) we can purchase a Weed Harvester and clean all our ponds and lakes (One of our greatest assets) and generate an income from it by renting it to other municipalities.  
At present we are paying \$364,000 per year for electricity for our municipal facilities. We could erect a Wind Generator on a high point of land on the Moraine for \$2 million, and become energy self-sufficient and prevent thousands of tons of pollutants from entering our atmosphere from our coal-fired generators.  
We will encourage only light and clean industry which is actively involved in cleaning up our environment or at least has no negative impact on it. We will strive to be known as an Environmentally Sensitive Town by preserving, maintaining and enhancing our green spaces, and our water supply. "The Little Town That Did It Right."  
Our ground water supply will not be sufficient for the projected population at which time we will be forced to drink Lake Ontario water. I do not want to drink Lake Ontario water (same pond we dump our sewage in) and I will ensure a Referendum on this question for the next election. This offers us a means of controlling our population. Act 36 (Walkerton) development should not be allowed to outstrip a sustainable water supply. "Water is a public trust and the public has a right to a significant role in decision-making processes with respect to water."
