BIOSOLIDS MASTER PLAN STUDY

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Region of Durham is undertaking a Master Plan Study to identify the preferred method of managing the solid residues that result from the treatment of municipal wastewater at the Region's water pollution control plants. These solid residues are referred to as *biosolids*. Wastewater and biosolids from York Region are also treated within Durham Region.

The Biosolids Master Plan is being prepared in accordance with the master planning provisions of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment*. This process integrates planning for municipal infrastructure requirements with the principals of environmental assessment planning. Based on these planning provisions, alternative methods of managing biosolids are being identified and evaluated based on an assessment of the following factors:


- Natural Environment
- Cultural Environment
- Social Environment
- Regulatory Requirements
- Economic Environment
- Technical Feasibility

A Public Information Centre for this project will be held on **Monday, March 8, 2004, between 4:00pm and 8:00pm at the Pickering Recreation Complex, East Entrance, O'Brien Room, 1867 Valley Farm Road, Pickering.** Representatives from the Region of Durham, and the project consultants, will present information on the project and answer questions from attendees. We encourage your involvement in this study to help us identify the issues that are important to you.
