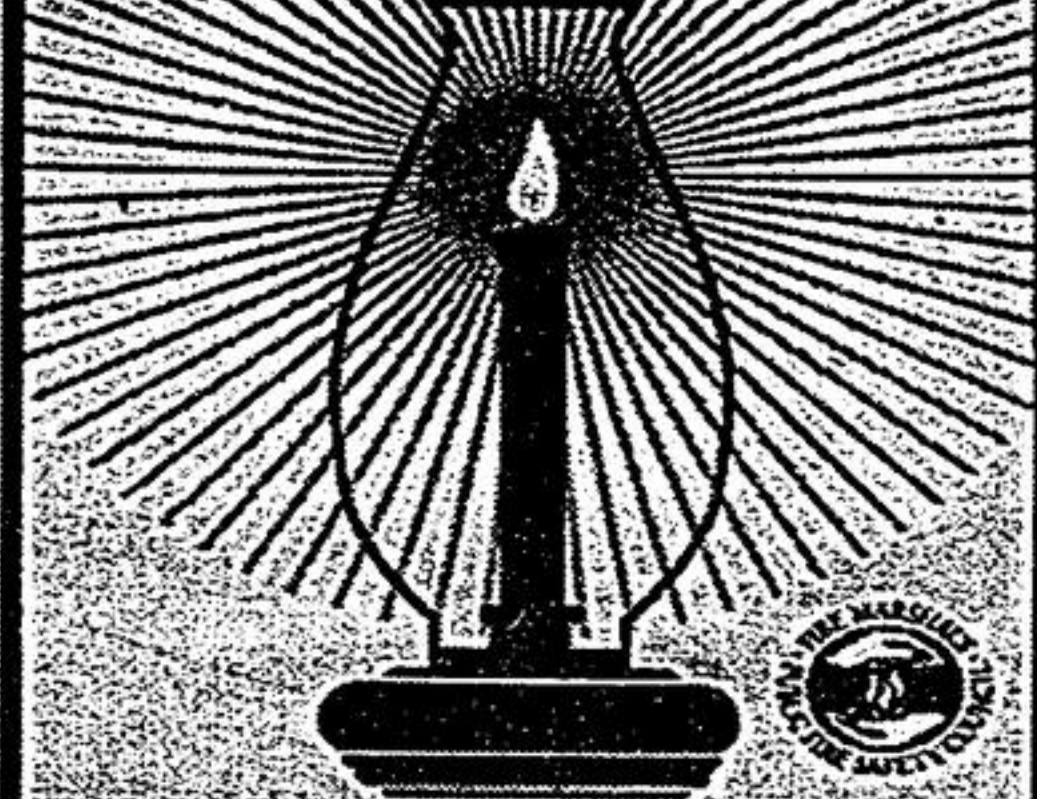

about water extraction the region says is required only at a few points along the route. Dave Probert of Whitchurch-Stouffville said the aquifer could take years to recover.

Compared to the 16th Avenue project, tunnelled deep underground and requiring constant water extraction, the Ninth Line sewer is shallow and largely dug along the surface.

The region, which hopes to complete the 9.5-kilometre main section from Major Mackenzie Drive to just north of 19th Avenue by November, says only one kilometre will be tunnelled.

Machines digging along the road and laying pipe from south to north won't have ground open for more than a couple of days, Mr. Subramaniam said. "As it's

moving ahead, they install the pipe behind it."

The final branches of the sewer in Stouffville require some additional pumping of groundwater.

The Toronto and Region Conservation Authority has approved a dam to stop silt flowing with extracted groundwater from reaching the Little Rouge, a cold water Rouge River tributary with brook trout and other sensitive species, said Rick Palmer, senior fisheries biologist for consultant Gartner Lee Ltd.

The final branches of the sewer in Stouffville require some additional pumping of groundwater, Mr. Palmer said.

The firm will pump water from a cold water creek flowing to the Little Rouge near the Ringwood pumping station in Whitchurch-Stouffville and from Stouffville Creek next month to show the effects of water extraction there.

The region may have to heat, clean and release some extracted groundwater to the cold water creek to ensure it does not run dry during four months of construction, much as it proposes to do for streams north of 16th Avenue, Mr. Palmer said.

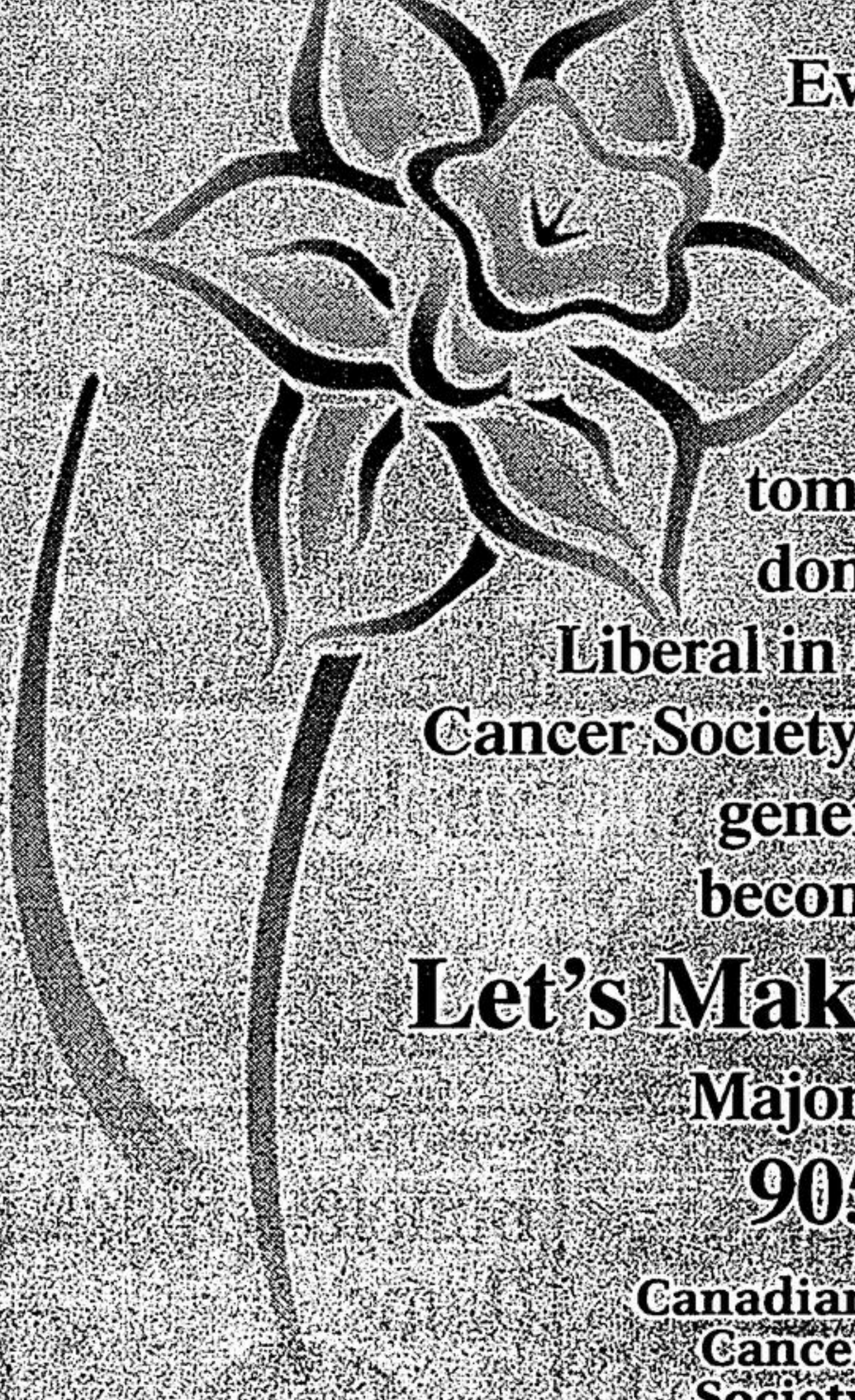
The region, meanwhile, expects to meet soon with provincial and federal agencies reviewing its plans to lessen environmental effects of the massive water-taking proposed to finish the 16th Avenue trunk, Mr. Subramaniam said.

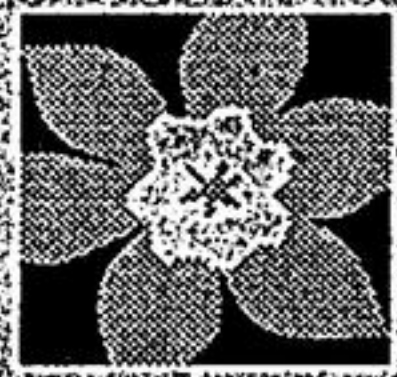
