ORGANIC COMPOSTING FACILITY

WONDERING WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR YARD WASTE?

PLEASE NOTE that as of April 1st, 2004, the Organic Yard Waste Composting Facility on Bloomington Road in Richmond Hill is no longer available to residents of York Region.

Residents may deliver yard waste to the new drop off location, free of charge, at 395 Harry Walker Parkway South in the Town of Newmarket (Harry Walker Parkway is located just west of Highway 404 and runs south off of Davis Drive).

DROP-OFF HOURS -
Monday to Friday - April 1st to November 30th (except statutory holidays) 8:00 am to 5:30 pm
Evenings - Tuesday evenings only to 8:00 pm
Saturdays - (except statutory holidays) 8:00 am to 5:30 pm

WHAT'S ACCEPTED -
leaves, grass clippings, shrubs, branches, weeds, vegetable garden waste, flowers and garden plants, sod (in small quantities)

WHAT'S NOT ACCEPTED -
tree branches and brush larger than 152 mm (6 inches) in diameter and 1.8 m (6 feet) long, stumps and root balls, driveway and road sweepings, kitchen and food wastes, animal droppings, rocks and stones, dirt and topsoil
