## Notice of Submission Terms of Reference Transportation Improvements in the Markham Bypass Corridor South of Highway 407

As part of the environmental assessment process for Transportation Improvements in the Markham Bypass Corridor South of Highway 407, the Regional Municipality of York is submitting Terms of Reference (ToR) to the Ontario Ministry of the Environment (MOE) for formal review as required under the provincial Environmental Assessment Act. If approved, the ToR will serve as a benchmark for the preparation and review of the environmental assessment document for this undertaking.

The purpose of the Undertaking is to address existing and future transportation deficiencies across the boundary of the southeastern areas of the Town of Markham and the developed areas and proposed to be developed areas of northeastern City of Toronto. A reasonable range of alternatives will be considered in order to address the need within the corridor. The Primary Study Area is identified in the key map below.

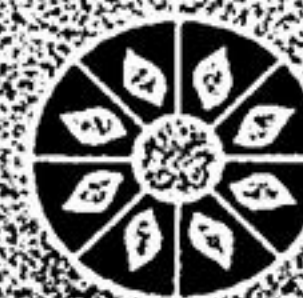
