

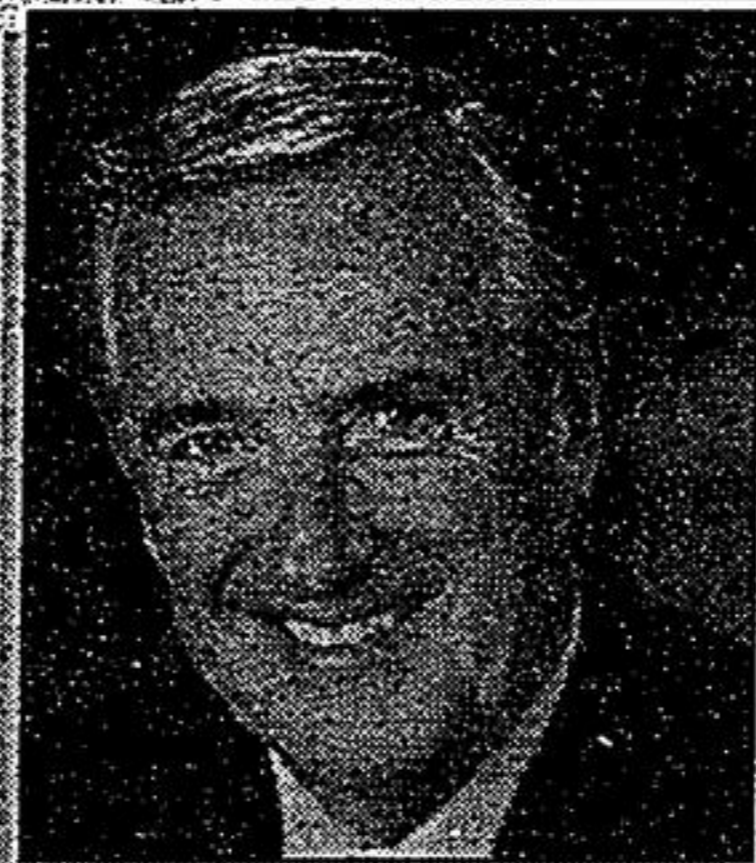

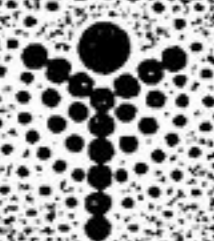

very, very honoured. But, I am very pleased the award is going to someone from the country." Mrs. Wells and her husband Grant have been dairy farmers in the Bloomington and McCowan roads area for many years.

The award, sponsored by the Stouffville Sun-Tribune, will be presented during the opening ceremonies of Strawberry Festival July 1 at 7 p.m. in Franklin Park tent in Stouffville Memorial Park. Mrs. Wells will also be in the festival parade July 3.

"Marion stood out from all of the nominees," Sun-Tribune editor Jim Mason said. "She has done so much for so many in our community. She was a natural choice of the selection committee. She is what this town is all about."

Mrs. Wells' volunteers service goes way back. Years ago, she formed the local Canadian Girls In Training branch and kept together for more than a decade, giving many women fond memories of the group.

Mrs. Wells volunteers for the food bank and Care and Share and remains active with the Lemonville United Church. She has served on the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library and Stouffville Recycling Group boards.

She has driven patients to their cancer treatment, lent a hand at plowing matches and been a strong advocate for

the needs of the community at the municipal level of government. If Mrs. Wells thinks taxes are getting out of hand in her rural Lemonville, she speaks up. Make no mistake, Whitchurch-Stouffville council listens.

At the same time, if a neighbour falls ill, Mrs. Wells can find the time to turn up with a bowl of hot soup and a hug. The people who know Mrs. Wells and nominated her for the award agree. She's solid, caring and there when needed.

Mrs. Wells' volunteer service has gone beyond Whitchurch-Stouffville. She's involved in the Evergreen Hospice program. As well, she's on the pastoral care unit at Markham Stouffville Hospital.

"I do little church services once a month at the hospital," Mrs. Wells said. "I've been with Markham Stouffville Hospital since before the first shovel went in the ground."

Married for 49 years, the Wells raised three children: Christine is a nurse, Kevin works for the Town of Markham and Ken is a farmer. The Wells have four grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

"Life is full," Mrs. Wells said.

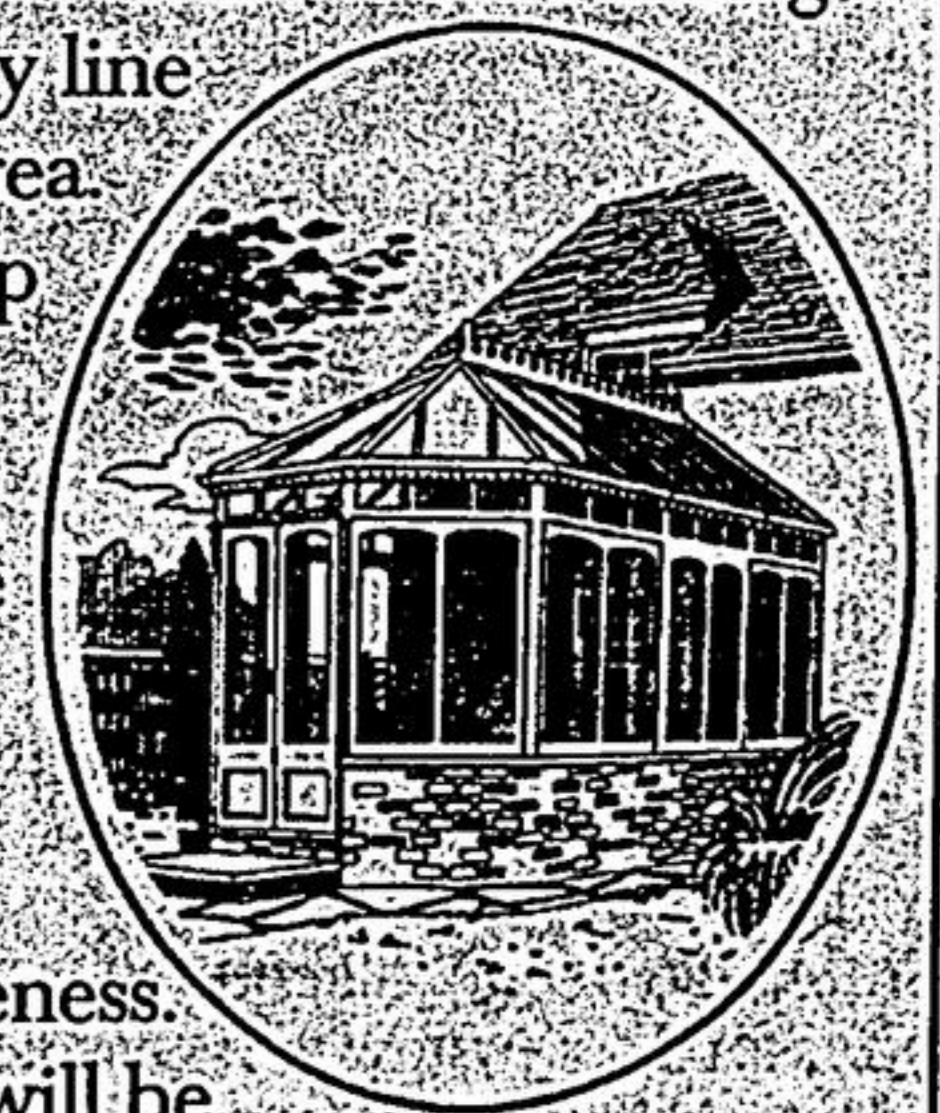
