Gibbons settles for second place in Clarington 200 at Mosport

Peter Gibbons drove his Canadian Tire-Monroe Brakes Chevrolet to a second-place finish in Sunday's CASCAR Super Series Clarington 200 race through the twists and turns on the 2.459-mile Mosport International Raceway road course.

Qualifying second for the main event and starting on the outside of the front row, the 41-year-old Stouffville-area resident settled into a routine and held onto second for the first few laps.

On lap four he slid back to third spot where he remained until lap 20.

After making a challenge for the lead he was called to the pits by crew chief Dave Hernen for four new tires and fuel on lap 27.

His pit crew gave Gibbons the quick stop he needed and he returned to the 10-turn race track in the second position.

Leader Jeff Lapcevich pitted on lap 31, but only took on two tires, which proved to be the winning move.

FAILED TO GAIN GROUND

Gibbons could not make up the track position needed between himself and Lapcevich and completed the

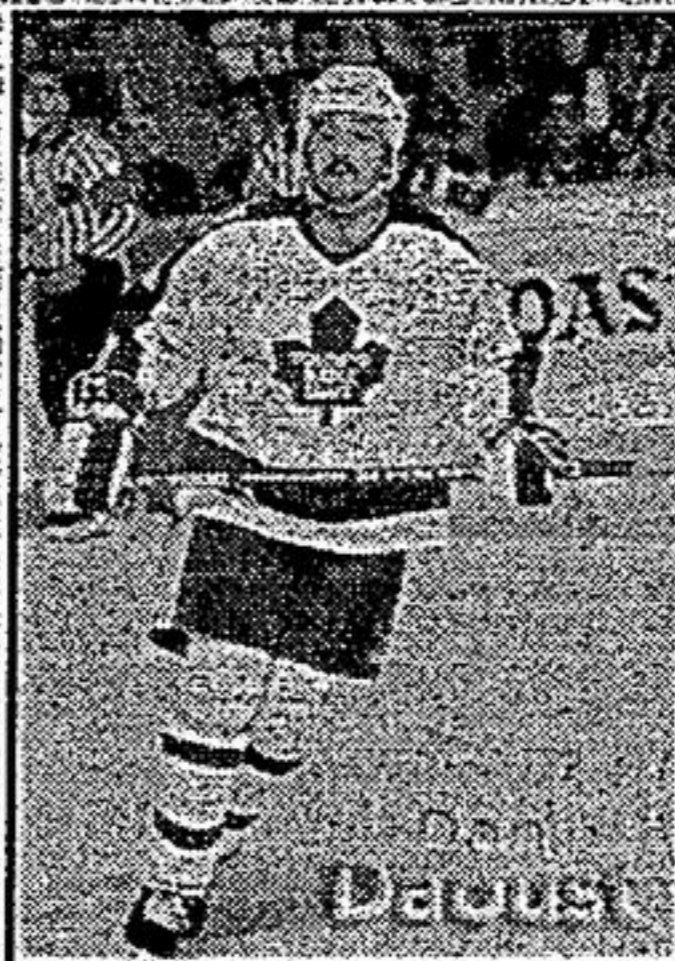
51-lap event in second spot.

Recording his fourth top-five finish in as many outings, Gibbons remained satisfied with his result.

"It was a good day for (our) car, of course we came here to win, but just came up a little short, we'll take second," he said.

Despite finishing second, Gibbons still holds the lead in the overall point series standings with 641. Dave Whitlock is second with 613.

Gibbons' next race is July 4 at the Cayuga 2000 Speedway near Hamilton for the Canada Day Shoot Out.
