an intimidating choice of up to as many as 15 different kinds of coffee, and that only includes cold ones.

Starbucks, offering more than 20 choices of cold coffee and teas, has, by far, the most intimidating selection.

Their original Frappuccino was launched across the United States in 1995, two years after a customer asked about making a cold coffee drink.

"Frappuccino blended beverages are truly a favourite among our customers," Deborah Ross, marketing manager for Starbucks Coffee Canada, said. "Our customers have told us that the Frappuccino is the ideal summer indulgence."

Only a few years ago, the suggestion

of drinking a cold coffee would have evoked expressions of disgust and outright refusals from even the most diehard coffee drinkers.

That attitude has changed dramatically for coffee drinkers such as Mr. Morrison, who have become as religious with their cold coffee drinks as they are with their hot caffeine rituals.

Diane Spruce, manager of Tim Hortons at Mulock and College Manor drives, said Iced Cappuccino is extremely popular with all age groups. "I have mothers who buy it to put in baby bottles," Ms Spruce said, laughing. "Everyone has received them with open arms."

Launched four years ago by the chain's head office, the Iced Cappuccino is the only cold coffee drink offered on

Tim Hortons menu and, despite its success, Ms Spruce doesn't believe the chain will expand its iced coffee menu.

"If it ain't broke, don't fix it."

The scenario is quite different heading into a local Second Cup, which has two types of cold coffee drinks and two types of cold tea drinks.

With a choice between flavours, such as vanilla bean, those four drinks become a multitude of flavour choices.

Ranjana Chopra, owner of a Newmarket Second Cup, attributes the popularity of cold drinks to their flavour.

"They're popular because they taste good and they're not going to harm you in the process," Mrs. Chopra said, referring to the fact their drinks are made with reduced-fat milk.

frailty or tenderness. And, again, the character's love for her son is tainted.

I didn't think I'd buy Ms Streep as corrupt, but to say I was wrong is an understatement. She is dazzling.

Liev Schreiber plays Laurence Harvey's part of the haughty and callous Sgt. Shaw, a Congressional Medal of Honour winner now seeking the presidential candidacy.

He's dominated by his politically savvy mother and seems to have fast-tracked his way to the White House in an uncommonly swift manner.

Nothing can get in his way, unless questions arise about his character or maybe his medal.

Mr. Washington plays the role that solidified Frank Sinatra's status as a fine

actor, the group leader whose recurring nightmares launch his suspicions and investigation into what happened to his men. Did Sgt. Shaw deserve his medal?

Mr. Washington is so incisive, so unrelenting and shaken by what he discovers that he is physically changed. He shakes uncontrollably, speaking in staccato spurts, always on high alert because he knows he is under surveillance and a hard target.

He's also on No-Doz, fearing those awful nightmares that suggest he may have murdered someone. He is the hunter and the hunted.

Director Jonathan Demme has made a career-long study of the human response to fear. His documentaries (*The Agronomist*) and feature work (*The Silence of the Lambs*) inform *The Manchurian Candidate*. His style is

unconventional, slightly skewed in a way that puts us off balance and forces us to question everything.

His work nearly always has a political scent. Politics and fear, what a mix. Isn't it interesting the film is being released in a U.S. presidential election year?

Mr. Sinatra purchased the rights to Richard Condon's novel and put together the 1962 film. In 1991, he gave his literary and talent agent daughter, Tina, permission to remake it.

He thought the times were right as corporate greed continually dominated headlines. It still holds today, with the added shading of Middle East military/corporate activity and Michael Moore's posit that corporate America needs war to turn profits.

This re-make really needed to happen, despite everything.
