

Mastercraft MAXIMUM Safety Recall Mastercraft Maximum Handsaw

Canadian Tire is voluntarily recalling the Mastercraft Maximum handsaw (Canadian Tire product numbers 57-7457 and 57-7458) sold at Canadian Tire stores between February 28, 2003 and July 2004. Canadian Tire has been advised of a safety issue with a similar product sold under the Stanley Tools (S.A.S.) brand in Europe.

It has been determined that due to a manufacturing defect, the seam of the saw's handle has the potential to split. This could result in the blade being exposed, therefore posing a potential safety issue. While Canadian Tire has not been notified of any instance of this occurring in Canada, there have been 6 reported minor injuries in Europe in connection with the use of the Stanley Tools (S.A.S.) brand product.



The handsaw can be identified as follows:

- 1) The handle of the saw is dual-coloured in blue and grey and is made of a combination of rubber and plastic
- 2) The blade of the saw is black nylon-coated (EZ slide coating) with the Mastercraft Maximum logo printed in white on the blade



Customers who have purchased this handsaw are asked to discontinue the use of this product immediately and to return it to their local Canadian Tire store for a refund or product exchange.

Kids have fun, help others during international games

Hundreds of children will be converging on the Christian Blind Mission International (CBMI) headquarters on Stouffville Road next week for the worldwide KidsGames.

This is the first time KidsGames have been held in Canada. Proceeds will go to a CBMI sponsorship program for children in developing countries.

The KidsGames concept gives children around the world the opportunity to take part in sports while helping other youngsters. Often organized by churches, the KidsGames have run in more than 200 countries around the world over the past three years. This year, 600,000 youngsters will take part.

CBMI will host soccer and basketball games run by members of Athletes in Action, a Christian sports ministry working with pro and elite athletes. The organization is a major organizer of KidsGames in Canada. Up to 250 youngsters are expected to take part in the Stouffville games.

Unionville Alliance Church's summer camp and Whitchurch-Stouffville's Springvale Baptist and Stouffville Pentecostal churches are bringing their Bible campers to the local KidsGames.

The Whitchurch-Stouffville churches will take part in the closing ceremonies hosted by the Toronto Blue Jays at Skydome Aug. 15. The ceremonies are open to the public.

The closing ceremonies feature the international water bucket championships, which are carried out all around the world. Team of 10 pass a

water bucket by hand from person to person. The team with the fullest bucket at the end of the event wins. Kids in Sudan train for this event, said Dan Sinclair, coordinator of the local KidsGames.
