# Kiwi calling rugby

Christian Blind Mission spokesperson Lindsay O'Connor is heading overseas to lend his Kiwi accent to the sport of rugby.

The native New Zealander is calling the Nov. 13 game between England and Canada from Twickenham, England for sports radio The FAN 590.

The broadcast begins at 4 p.m. More than 60,000 fans are expected to attend the sold-out match.

Mr. O'Connor's weekly sports report is on The FAN 590 every Saturday between 4 and 6 p.m.

He's been calling rugby action throughout North America for the past six years. This is his second time broadcasting from Twickenham.

Last week Mr. O'Connor called the action at the McCormick Cup at Fletchers Field in Markham for York Region Live on Rogers Television. The Balmy Beach team from east Toronto broke the Toronto Irish's 14-game winning streak with a score of 10-0 in front of 1,500 fans.

Mr. O'Connor began playing rugby when he was five, eventually representing his province of Canterbury in New Zealand. He later became a rugby referee.

### Coins appraised to help Parkview

Anyone wondering if that box of old coins sitting in the garage is worth anything can find out Nov. 20.

Coin expert Eric Lismanis will be at Parkview Village to appraise coins and coin collections between 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. to support the Parkview Home building fund. Anyone who wants to donate coins receives a tax receipt for the collection's value.

People having coins appraised are asked to donate \$5 for an appraisal of up to 10 coins and \$10 for more.

But, don't wash or clean those coins, Mr. Lismanis said. That will greatly reduce their value. The colouring that may appear dirty is just the patina, he explained.

Mr. Lismanis, the town's former economic development officer, began collecting coins as a youth and became an appraiser 20 years ago.

One collection he was asked to appraise yielded four 1948 Canadian silver dollars worth about \$1,500 each. A 1921 50-cent piece in good condition could be worth up to \$30,000, he said.
