Higher density housing unwanted in Legacy

enough, according to the report. About 64 per cent of units built between 1991 and 2003 were single detached homes, a percentage exceeded only by Durham.

The region's "live work ratio" is lowest in the GTA and it relies heavily on "in-commuters" who contribute to traffic congestion and may disappoint employers by eventually choosing to work closer to home, the report says.

Some Options for Homes buyers were living in illegal basement apartments and wanted out of them, Mr. Labbe said.

He added Markham council

enthusiastically supports building condos in Milliken, a short walk from Steeles Avenue.

It has adopted a different attitude, however, to future housing on two parcels in Markham's east-end Legacy development.

RESIDENTS OPPOSED

After hearing strong opposition from residents who felt high density zoning for the two 1.6-acre blocks was not "compatible" with the rest of Legacy, the town took steps to change their density to "medium".

The provincially-owned land is next to a future park site and a transit station south of Hwy. 407. The town previously judged high

density "appropriate along the Hwy. 407 corridor or adjacent to a transit station" and said it would yield 50 units per parcel, including 33 to 60 units an acre as row houses, multiplexes, stacked townhouses or apartments.

In an interview last month, Councillor John Webster called the proposed change to medium density "a non-event". "It's not going to make a huge difference in the general scheme of things," he said.

Legacy ratepayer president Don Hutchinson said medium density will mean single homes but high density could have meant six-storey apartment buildings.
