### Celebrity hockey tickets sell out in 19 minutes

More than 1,000 tickets for a charity hockey game featuring Toronto Maple Leaf players sold out in 19 minutes Saturday.

Game of our Lives II, benefitting cancer-related charities, will be played Sunday at the Stouffville Arena.

The celebrity team which will play the Stouffville Spirit Jr. A squad, features Toronto Maple Leafs Gary Roberts, Tie Domi, Joe Nieuwendyk and Ed Belfour and Detroit Red Wing Steve Thomas.

Ex-NHLers Doug Gilmour, Wendel Clark, Nick Kypreos and Pat Flatley are also confirmed.

Retired NHL linesman Ray Scapinello will be part of the officiating crew.

Leafs assistant coach and Stouffville resident Keith Acton is again behind the game. The 2002 version drew Don Cherry, Ron MacLean and Pat Quinn and raised more than \$20,000 for cancer-related charities. This year's event has already topped that total.

Proceeds this time will go to cancer-related charities including the UFCW Leukemia Research Fund and the oncology unit at Markham Stouffville Hospital.

Fans will be able to bid on jerseys worn by some of the celebrity players and buy tickets on raffle prizes.
