"The public should have the opportunity to see the quality of talent in York Region," talent search vice chairperson Marsha


Winton said.

seven years.

But Thursday's cuts don't go far enough, according to Markham Regional Councillor Jack Heath.

"We're down to 6.1 per cent, but that's still not good enough," Mr. Heath said. "This budget has been described as ambitious and maybe that's the problem; maybe we're trying to

do too much."

Finance chairperson and Markham Mayor Don Cousens, who issued a call last month for a 5-per-cent limit on any regional tax hike, believes there may be room for more trimming.


"We've come a long way, but now we must ask ourselves where else can we make cuts responsibly," he said.

Councillors also discussed the region's contribution to the GTA social welfare pool, which will top \$85 million this year, \$7.5 million more than 2004.

Regional chairperson Bill Fisch said the 6.1-per-cent tax hike would drop to 4.8 per cent if council opts to freeze its contribution at the 2004 level.

"It's still an option for council to consider," Mr. Fisch said following Thursday's meeting. "The big question is what happens if we take that \$7.5 million out of the budget and then the province orders us to pay it?


