Provision of Additional Capacity for the Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant



NOTICE OF PUBLIC WORKSHOPS

The Regional Municipalities of York and Durham are undertaking a joint study to identify the preferred method of providing additional capacity for the Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP) to service future growth in the urban areas of York and Durham Regions.

Located in the City of Pickering, the Duffin Creek WPCP treats the wastewater flows collected by the York-Durham Sewage System (YDSS), which provides sanitary sewer service to portions of York Region and Durham Region. Population and employment growth forecasted for the service areas of both York and Durham Regions will ultimately generate sanitary sewage flows beyond the existing capacity of the Duffin Creek WPCP.

This study is proceeding under Schedule 'C' of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000)*. The Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) is a five-phase study that includes an extensive evaluation of the impacts to plants and animals, soils, traffic patterns, residents and businesses in the community. We are currently in the third phase of the study, which involves an assessment of the alternative design concepts.

PUBLIC WORKSHOPS

Members of the public are invited to attend one of two public workshops to obtain information on the study and provide input to the Regions. Attendees will have an opportunity to examine and provide comment on the alternative treatment strategies that are under consideration, and the implementation plan for expansion of the Duffin Creek WPCP.

As both workshops will cover the same issues, attendance at only one is recommended. An optional plant tour will be held earlier in the day for participants attending the workshop in Durham Region. The date, time and location of the Public Workshops are as follows:
