

Rehearsals in high gear for Music Mania

Sequins, black lights, hilarious skits and loads of music and dancing return to Stouffville for the 45th annual Music Mania variety show next month.

More than 150 people have been rehearsing for the show *Everything Old is News Again* since the beginning of the year. Performances are April 28 to 30 in the Stouffville District Secondary School auditorium.

New this year is the addition of the Men of Note chorus. It will perform with the Music Mania chorus as well as on its own.

The chorus features a new music director, Margot Rejskind, who succeeded Jeffrey McAloon. He was transferred by his company to Saint John, New Brunswick, in December.

With a doctorate in musical arts and literature from the University of Illinois, Ms Rejskind has directed a number of choirs

and choruses including the Concordia University Concert Choir, the McGill University Women's Chorale in Montreal and the University of Illinois Concert Choir.

She is a trained singer and founding member of a six-member professional group performing medieval and renaissance music.

Longtime Music Mania member Heather Andrews, who returned to the show chorus after a two-year break, noted the men are

back in the chorus.

Last year, only two men joined women in the chorus; this year, there are 14 in the 40-voice choir.

Some songs will be performed in more than one style and "there are a couple of tear-jerkers", Ms Andrews said.

There are a number of people following their parents' footsteps in the show. Bonnie Neprily, 22, Emily Martin, 20, and 25-year-old Jeff Larkin join the dancers while Siobhan Baxter takes

on the job of auditorium manager.

Tickets for the show are \$15 for adults and \$6 for children 12 and younger.
