

Detective work finds hurt senior

Acting on a hunch, a maintenance worker found an elderly Stouffville woman injured at the bottom of a flight of stairs following an all-day search Wednesday.

When Lyn Webber, 85, failed to return to her home at Buckingham Manor in downtown Stouffville at 10:30 a.m., a search was launched. It included York Regional Police.

As the hours stretched by with no sign of the woman, Ivan (Duffy) Barron, a maintenance worker at the seniors' home, took a few minutes to think about Mrs. Webber's routine.

During her morning walk, Mr. Barron knew Mrs. Webber often

dropped into the Savex Drug Mart on Main Street.

"I had a hunch," Mr. Barron said. "Something told me to go to the store and ask if Mrs. Webber had dropped in."

At the store, he was told Mrs. Webber had been in, made a purchase and asked to use the washroom at the back of the store.

The clerk then realized Mrs. Webber had not returned from the washroom, which is near the entrance to the store's basement.

"We rushed to the back of the store and found her lying at the foot of the stairs," Mr. Barron said.

Mrs. Webber was found at 2:40 p.m., Const. Kim Killby said, adding she had fallen and struck her head.

Mrs. Webber was taken by ambulance to Markham Stouffville Hospital and treated for a head injury and a sprained ankle. She returned to Buckingham Manor in the evening.

When Mr. Barron arrived at work Thursday morning, he was greeted with a bouquet of flowers, a gift from Mrs. Webber's niece, and, most important, a big hug from Mrs. Webber.

"I'm just so glad, she'll be all right," Mr. Barron said.

Walkathon canvasser may be fraud

York Regional Police are warning a man canvassing for the annual Persechini Easter Seals walkathon may be a fraud.

Suspicious citizens called police when a man going door to door in the Aurora area for the annual run/walkathon refused to accept donations by cheque.

The Easter Seal Society says it accepts donations made by cash or cheque.

The suspect is a white male, in his mid-20s, five-feet, nine-inches tall with a medium complexion, blond or brown hair and wearing baggy jeans.

As a precaution, police say residents should always ask for identification from people soliciting

funds. Ask for written information, a receipt, never feel pressured to donate and contact the local association of the organization to confirm if it is holding a fundraising drive.

The event is the largest fundraising event in York Region in support of Easter Seals children and will be held May 29.
