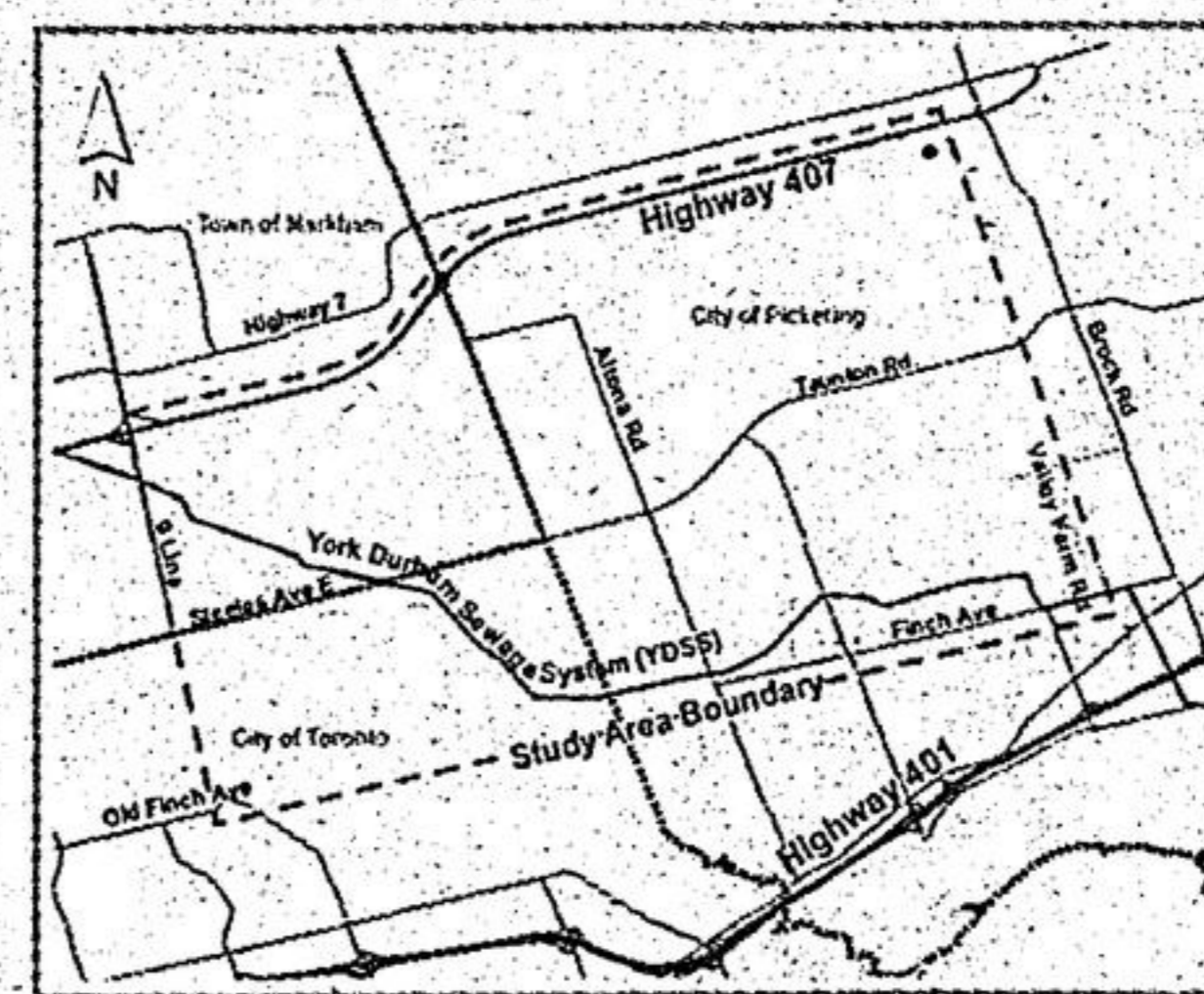

York Region originally initiated a project in accordance with Schedule 'B' of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) in October 2001 for obtaining Environmental Assessment Act (EA Act) approval for expanding the existing York-Durham Sewage System (YDSS) Southeast Collector Trunk Sewer within York Region to accommodate additional sanitary flows. The YDSS currently conveys sanitary flows from the municipalities of Newmarket, Richmond Hill, Aurora, Markham, Vaughan and Pickering to the Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant located in the City of Pickering for treatment.



On October 1, 2004, the Minister of the Environment (Minister) notified York Region that the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) had received submissions requesting that an Individual EA be prepared for all remaining unfinished sections of the YDSS including the Southeast Collector. As a result, pursuant to subsection 16(1) of the EA Act, the Minister ordered York Region to comply with Part II of the EA Act for the Southeast Collector project (extending from 9th Line in York Region to Valley Farm Road in the Regional Municipality of Durham) and carry out an Individual EA. Durham Region will be a co-proponent with York Region on the Individual EA since a portion of the study area is within Durham Region.

The Individual EA consists of a two-step EA approval process for proposed undertakings in the Province of Ontario. The first step is development of a Terms of Reference (ToR), which sets out the proposed framework that will be followed during the second step, the preparation and review of the Southeast Collector Trunk Sewer EA. The ToR represents an agreement between the proponent and the Minister about what is required in the EA to address the legislated requirements of the EA Act.

York Region and Durham Region have prepared a draft of the ToR for public review and comment. A copy of the Draft ToR is available for review on the project website: <http://sec.cenet.ca> and at the locations indicated below.
