Family survives Hwy. 404 crash

Firefighters free mother from van

It took firefighters more than an hour to free a trapped mother from an overturned mini-van following a collision on Hwy. 404, south of Bloomington Road Tuesday night.

A one-year old baby escaped serious injury in the collision, which closed the north-bound lanes of Hwy. 404 for five hours.

The baby's grandmother was admitted to hospital.

While firefighters managed to free the father within minutes, it took about an hour to pull the mother from the wreck.

The father, unconscious at the scene, was taken to Sunnybrook Health Science Centre, while the mother and the children were all taken by ambulance to a nearby hospital. The baby was treated and released.

The condition of both

parents was upgraded to non-life threatening yesterday morning.

"The woman was pinned between the roof and the ground," Whitchurch-Stouffville Fire and Emergency Services Capt. Tom Brillinger said. "We took extra time in freeing her out of consideration for her injuries."

OPP acting Sgt. Doug Fenske said the collision occurred at about 8:30 p.m. when a Mazda mini-van, northbound in the right lane, was struck from behind by a speeding Infiniti-G35. The collision caused the mini-van to lose control and roll over into the east ditch.

"Witnesses reported that the (male) driver of the car was weaving in and out of traffic," Sgt. Fenske said.

The investigation into the accident continues.

The OPP is seeking witnesses.
